After 21 years of engagement, the Communication on Progress (COP) remains a necessary tool which brings more transparency and helps us in measuring our achievements and progresses both internally and externally. The EDF Group has been reporting at the "Advanced level" since 2012 and is committed to maintain this level of excellence in the future.

In addition, EDF is reaching its goal to become an increasingly sustainable business notably through the implementation of its "raison d'être" adopted in May 2020 *"To build a net zero energy future with electricity and innovative solutions and services, to help save the planet and drive wellbeing and economic development"*. Our "raison d'être" reiterates the UN Global Compact principles and the UN Sustainable Development Goals through our 16 CSR commitments organized around 4 issues: Carbon neutrality & Climate, Planet resources preservation, Wellbeing & Solidarity and Responsible development. In March 2021, I signed a new document summarizing our commitments and requirements in terms of human rights and fundamental freedoms, Health and safety and Environment and Business ethic in order to make them more visible to our stakeholders and further implement them within the Group and with our business partners.
