# Women Empowerment

RSKS India has been working successfully from last 28 years in the pivotal topic women empowerment and has established new pillars of success by successfully working towards women empowerment. Rural women and girls have become self-reliant and courageous due to the work done by RSKS India at the ground level and now they have also become free from the social evils and bondage. Only by making empowerment a verdict, women can make their own presence in the male dominated society and can also lead the society. RSKS India successfully did the following projects for women empowerment:-

## Stop Violence Against Women

**Objectives / Goals:** - RSKS India decides the objective/ goals of the project through proper planning as RSKS India believes in the impact of the project. In this context, the main objectives of this project were to bring gender equality within the male dominated society, respect for women, end social malpractices, decrease in dowry system, that women should also have equal rights in the society and also to aware the women and girls about abuse and what to do when abused.

**Description:-** Women and girls living in backward areas face so many problems in their daily life, problems like eve teasing, domestic violence, gender inequality, female foeticide etc. This happens often in these backward areas due to lack of awareness and the conservative thinking of the backward area people. Against this, RSKS India did many programs in the 31 inaccessible villages of Pisangan & Srinagar block and awareness activities like workshop, posters, street plays, rallies and road shows were conducted on a large scale at the ground level. The message of prevention of violence against women reached the male dominated society. This year, many awareness workshops on social evils like eradication of women violence, child marriage, gender inequality, dowry etc. was organized by RSKS India.

RSKS India through 1243 direct beneficiaries spread awareness to thousands of people by street plays, puppet shows, rallies, road shows, signature campaigns, the rural masses were made aware and message of creating a women violence free society was given.

In a unique initiative under this project, the organization also explained the good touch and bad touch knowledge to the small school children. Under this program, information about good touch and bad touch was given to school children through flip chart, color chart etc at 6 locations and with 216 children.



## Women Empowerment

### Achievements:-

1. RSKS India organized awareness programs in 31 villages of Pisangan & Srinagar block.
2. RSKS India organized many workshops and activities in which around 1243 people participated.
3. Thousands of women and men got aware through awareness activities.
4. Program of Good Touch and Bad Touch was organized at 6 locations and with 216 children.
5. Small Change in the typical mindset of rural people was seen through these activities.
6. Inspired and encouraged so many women and girls of rural backward areas.
7. Confidence was built up in these women and girls through these awareness programs.
8. These women and girls will now aware other women and girls too and will act as someone's savior.



## Self Help Group Project

**Objective / Goal:-** Women Empowerment surely needs a woman to become self reliant and in this context, the main objective of this project was to achieve socio-economic development of rural women through mobilization and to provide leadership in the society by eradicating the distinction between high and low. Also to provide low interest loans to the future women entrepreneurs from villages or rural background.

**Description:-** It has been said that “Two is better than One” because being in community and forming groups helps all the people in the Groups. In this context, Self help group project was being operated by RSKS India in many inaccessible regions of many villages. Through SHG, women of poor and disadvantaged communities were being empowered financially by building up

their capacities and increasing self-confidence. More than 300 SHGs were running this year by the RSKS Organization and RSKS India provided them with financial assistance for economic activity by banks.

Approx 3000 women have become a part of SHG project run by RSKS India. All SHG's had monthly basis meeting to discuss employment and work of women. RSKS Team members also informed them about financial and banking sector. With financial support, women have set up employment units and have been doing self employment. RSKS India supports them in both farming (azolla farming, kitchen garden, vermin compost etc) as well as non farming sector (like cattle husbandry, fish husbandry, vegetable shop etc).

## Women Empowerment

### Achievements:-

- » RSKS India organized SHG program in many inaccessible regional villages.
- » 300 SHGs are running with active participation of approx 3000 women.
- » 94% women attended SHG bank per month.
- » All women are involved in business activity.
- » Women are working in farming and non farming sector.
- » Women of SHG groups became self reliant.
- » 100% women got knowledge of banking sector.

## Capacity Building, Life Skills And Leadership Training

**Objective / Goal:-** Encouraging and motivation plays an important role in anyone's development. So the objective/ Goal of this project is to increase the capacity and life skills of women of self-help groups, so that they can better manage economic resources and ensure their livelihood. Also to provide them leadership training so that they could step up in their community and do what they want to do with full determination.



**Description:-** As Encouragement and motivation plays an important role in anyone's development, RSKS India planned to organize trainings by which the women of SHG would know themselves better and their confidence would become higher. So under this program, self-help group women were trained by capacity building training, life skills training, leadership training and primary bank education by RSKS India team members.

This year, all the SHGs women were imparted various types of training. Through this training, the ability of women along with their knowledge has increased which resulted in increase in their confidence level. Also these women of SHG's were able to speak up their ideas in front of their family members.

### Achievements:-

- All the SHG's were given different types of training.
- The participation of women in government and panchayati programs increased.
- Approx 3000 women got the benefit of training and their orientation was done.
- After training, 100% trained women gained capacity building and knowledge of life skills.
- SHG women were able to act as leaders in their respective fields.
- Confidence level of SHG women increased.

## EDUCATION



RSKS India worked very hard to improve the education of rural and marginalized community girls in this pandemic created due to corona virus. The lockdown due to covid-19 resulted in closing of all the schools and also many rural and marginalized parents were unable to provide education materials to their daughters. In this harsh time, RSKS India did all the possible things for the education of the girls so that in future they could become something they wanted and could support the nation.

### Pathshala: - A Platform for Quality Education

**Objective / Goal:** - Education helps in the development of nation. In this context, the objective/goal of this project is to connect the poor and deprived community girls of 6 to 14 years old with mainstream education by giving them quality education through the Pathshala schools.

**Description:** To provide quality education to the rural, marginalized and deprived community girls, RSKS India organized "Pathshala" school. This is a model of girl education development, in which RSKS India worked to connect the school drop-out girls of 6 to 14 years old with the mainstream education. Although the Pathshala school faced many problems this year due to the corona pandemic and lockdown in our area, but RSKS India with full determination provided free quality education to 30 girls of Pathshala school through digital mediums and also through offline means when the covid situation got under control.

In this school all the festivals were celebrated with full enthusiasm and all the girls participated in all the programs. Also the parents of these girls were very happy with the school and also attended all the meetings and programs of the school. In this school, the basic knowledge of English, Discipline, Hygiene, Maths, Rights, Sports etc were also given for the development of these girls.

The main focus of RSKS was to provide quality education so that these girls can be linked to mainstream education. Sports and recreational activities were also organized in the school every week for the healthy growth of girls. Periodical festivals, social days were also celebrated with great enthusiasm.

#### Achievements:-

- ★ RSKS India operated a Pathshala school in a remote village.
- ★ 30 girls got better education in Pathshala school.
- ★ Improvement was seen in the education level of these girls.
- ★ One day per week, education of discipline, sanitation, moral values were taught.
- ★ Organized exercise, yoga, and sports for one day per week.
- ★ Organized festival and social days in Pathshala.
- ★ Girls got basic knowledge of English.



## EDUCATION



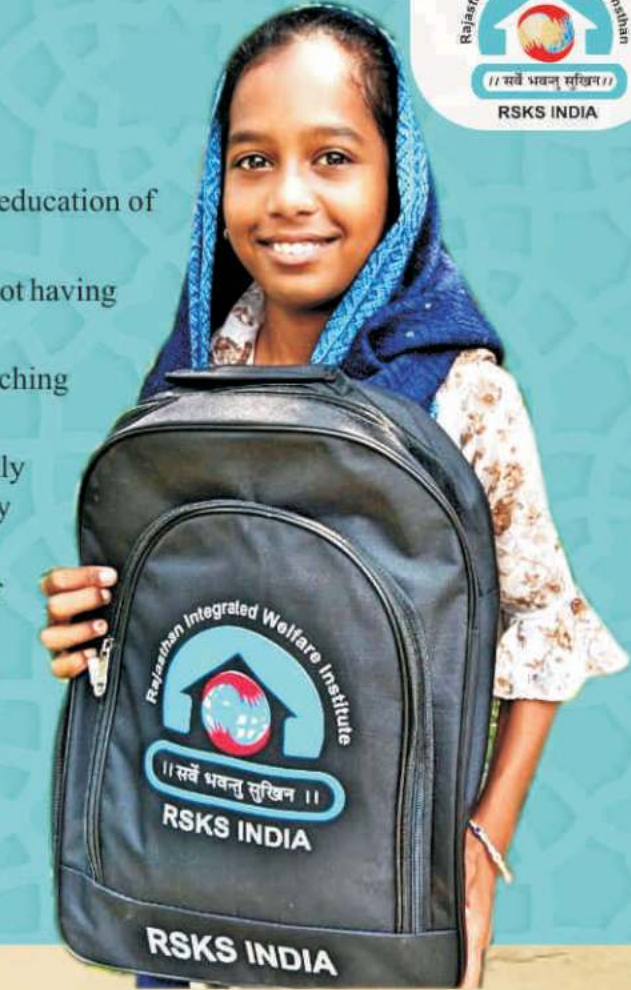
**Objective/Goal:** - Parents of many rural and marginalized community girls were not able to provide education materials to their daughters due to financial problems arose due to the corona pandemic. So the objective/goal of the project was that education of any poor deprived community or needy girl child should not be interrupted and they should not be deprived of education due to lack of education materials.

**Description:-** Education of the people living in the country contributes to the growth of the nation and that is why education is the equal right of all children, men and women. In this corona period, when everything were closed including schools the students as well as the parents faced many problems. These were the people belonging to the marginalized, deprived communities. They had lost their employment and at the same time their daughters needed the school supplies for their education which the parents were not able to provide and this could result in school drop for the girl children. So to provide girl children a better education, RSKS India came forward to support the girl child education.

In this context, RSKS India distributed education materials like copies, book, notebooks, rubber, pencils school dress, school bags, shoes, color sets etc and hygiene kit (sanitary napkin, sanitizers, cloth masks etc) to 6-17 years old school girls to ensure that there is no hindrance in the education of these girls belonging to the rural and marginalized communities and also to protect themselves and their family from novel corona virus, hygiene kits were also provided by RSKS India to these girls which contained sanitizers, hanky, cloth masks, soap, sanitary napkins etc. This year, RSKS India distributed education materials and hygiene kits to 600 girls belonging from different villages of Pisangan block. These girls were selected through the help of principal of school, school administration, village official and RSKS Team members through the baseline survey and then they were distributed these materials.

### Achievements:-

1. Education material was distributed for the development of education of 600 girls.
2. All 600 girls are relaxed and studying at home and they are not having any kind of difficulty.
3. These girls are studying regularly every day and are also teaching younger siblings at home.
4. These girls could now protect themselves and their family from novel corona virus through the hygiene kits provided by RSKS India.
5. These girls did not drop out from the schools due to lack of education materials.

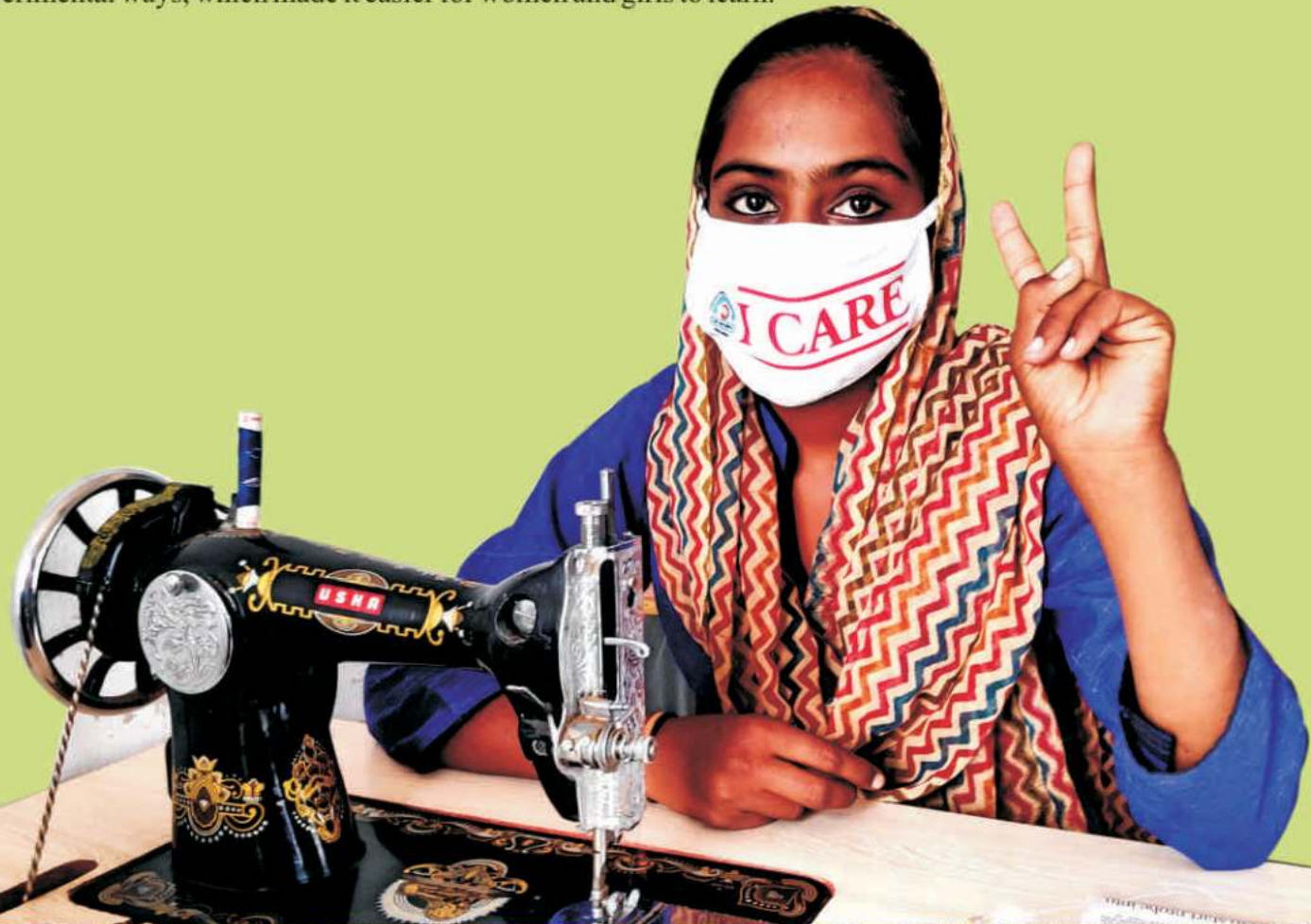


## Build Bright Future For Marginalized Girls & Women

**Objectives / Goals:** - Making young girls and women to be able to learn skill and become self-reliant. Ensure skill development training as a weapon for young women and girls. & making these girls self-reliant and successful.

**Description:-** In this covid era, when many people were losing their job due to lockdown, RSKS India started Skill development trainings for young girls and women belonging from poor, deprived communities in order to make these women and girls of poor and deprived communities in rural areas economical, empowered and self-reliant.

RSKS India organized 8 different skill development trainings to women in 2 different trades which were Advanced Garment Making & Beauty Parlour. In these trainings, priority was given to divorced, widowed, disabled, violence-affected women. Since the training was conducted in rural areas, the training was given in theoretical and experimental ways, which made it easier for women and girls to learn.



This year, 8 batches were organized by RSKS India in which 153 women and young girls were benefitted through these skill development trainings. It is said that “Toppings at Cakes makes it beautiful” so in this context, RSKS India also gave trainings of life skills, leadership, capacity building etc to these young women and girls, which also increased the self-confidence and courage of these young girls and women.

For the success of training and making women self-employed, RSKS India organized an exhibition, hut market and a job fair to provide better employment opportunities to these rural and marginalized community women and young girls. Sports and recreational activities were also organized from time to time at these skill development training centers. Their skill net groups were also formed during training to keep the trainees women and girls together even after the training. These trainees meet every month and share their experiences and support each other. Mobilization of these groups gave stability to the project. In these skill net group meetings, women and girls also discussed employment and strategies for the future.



### Achievements:-

- » RSKS India taught 2 different trades to the young girls and women from rural and marginalized community.
- » 153 women were made employable and self-reliant with a total of 8 skill development training batches.
- » The training was done in experimental and theoretical ways.
- » RSKS India Organized many sports and recreational activities during training in which the women and girls participated enthusiastically.
- » Organized life skill, leadership, and capacity building training to make women and girls self-reliant.
- » Organized exhibition/hut market to learn marketing tricks.
- » Job fairs were organized to provide employment opportunities.
- » Skill Net Groups/SHG's were formed and loans were arranged to stabilize the work and start employment.
- » Hut bazaars and exhibitions were organized.

## EDP: - Successful Entrepreneurship Training

**Objectives:** - To kick start the entrepreneurs hidden inside the rural young girls and women and Provide better management and guidance in order to use skills and intelligence for setting up of employment unit.

**Description:** - It has often seen that despite having better skill/knowledge, young rural girls and women are unable to do jobs because they do not know how to get better management and guidance for employment. Therefore, EDP training was organized for women and girls by RSKS India. 153 women of 8 batches were given EDP training which was organized by the RSKS India this year. Through this training, young girls and women learned the tricks of successful entrepreneurship and learned better management for employment. Through EDP training, the women learned closely about self-employment and also gained knowledge of work efficiency. After learning from this training, most of the women approached for self-employment and started a start-up and became self-reliant.

### Achievements:-

- ✳ Organized EDP training in 8 batches.
- ✳ 153 young women and girls learned the tricks of successful entrepreneurship.
- ✳ Women and girls learned tricks of employment and better supervision through training.
- ✳ After EDP training, women got self-employed and made a move towards empowerment.
- ✳ Rural women and girls were able to hear from successful entrepreneurs.



# Sustainable Livelihood



**Objectives/ Goals:-** RSKS India works to empower the people with disabilities in the five important areas which are health, education, employment, social and empowerment. Also to increase disabled people participation in society by making them self-reliant.

**Description:-** In this era of covid-19 the need for uplifting the people and children with disabilities was most important as they faced many problems during the lockdown so Under the Disabled Welfare Project of RSKS India, RSKS India aimed to make people with disabilities stronger in education, health, employment, social security and empowerment and add them to the mainstream of the society.

To do this task, RSKS India was already working in 16 villages of Pisangan block and with 460 disabled people & children. There was no age limit in this project as disabled of any age do suffer in today's time, hence the organization was constantly fighting for the uplifting of disabled people. The activities/work done on each of the education, health, employment, social security and empowerment areas are as follows:-

Under this program, many beneficial things like aadhar cards, disabled cards, UDID cards, disabled pension etc were made of more than 40 handicapped people, which was their basic right. In order to enable the disabled people to become more empowered, discussions on employment was done in the DPO (Disabled People Organization) meetings of village.

The sustainability of the project required all handicapped people to be grouped together in solidarity, for which many DPO groups were formed earlier in the project area by RSKS India. The purpose of DPO's was that people with disabilities should be organized in groups so that they could fight united for their rights and become economically and socially empowered. Monthly DPO meetings were held by RSKS members in which, the problems of disabled people and disabled children were discussed as well as the solution for the problems were also discussed. Information about the government schemes for the disabled were also given in the DPO meetings by the RSKS Team members.

The DPO became a platform where people with disabilities were fighting altogether for their rights and working for the benefit of the disabled. Through the DPO, all the disabled people were able to follow up every month, so that their work information and problem is resolved continuously.

Under this project, special attention was given to children with disabilities from 0 to 14 years as this age is their learning period but disability impedes them from learning. Therefore, RSKS team workers did home based activities and daily living activities with these children. Under the Home based activities and daily living activities, the handicapped children were taught about:-

- » Identifying the obstacles.
- » How to overcome that obstacle easily.
- » Learning how to comb hairs.
- » How to wash face and be hygienic.
- » Teaching them Counting, English, Maths etc.
- » Different colours and textures.
- » Different games and also how to play them.
- » How the disabled child can do or make people understand about their daily living tasks like eating food when hungry, going to washroom, drinking water when thirsty etc.



## DISABILITY

Special attention was given on the handicapped children as they are not able to do daily activities by themselves and are dependent on the family. Therefore, the family members were also taught about how to make the daily activities of the child accessible so that they can do it themselves and then the parents can do their own work.

Disabled children need more attention to educate so Simple tools, charts, color cards, matching cards, etc were used to teach the disabled children. Also in this corona pandemic, RSKS India did video calls with these disabled families to know about their health and education and their difficulties during the pandemic.

The role of family members was important in this period as they were regularly with the disabled child, so whatever activity is done, their family members were involved and they were taught the same so that they can regularly repeat the activities at home.

## HEALTH

### Achievements:-

- » Home based activities and Activities of daily living was done with around 20 children with disabilities. In which families of CWD also participated.
- » Around 10 PWD's who have many difficulties related to mobility were taught by home based activities which helped them a lot.
- » Approx 25 parents of children with disabilities were told about the cleanliness in the daily work.
- » Functional ability was taught to approx 20 CWD's so that they can learn self care.
- » 2 CWD who were malnourished were given regularly nutritious food with the help of Anganbadi workers.



## EDUCATION

- In the field of education, home based education was being imparted to children with disabilities. Educational activities like touch, shape, counting were done in the home based activity with the around 20 CWD's.
- In 16 villages, Meeting With School Teachers was done for Education Support of School going CWDs
- Conducted 2 Mother Supporting Group monthly meeting.
- Volunteers supported children with disabilities in education, so that the education of children with disabilities could continue.





## LIVELIHOOD

- ◆ Around 10 PWD's did sewing in order to earn for their living.
- ◆ Aadhaar cards and Jan Aadhaar cards were made of approx 20 disabled people.
- ◆ Disable Certificate /UDID cards were made of around 15 disabled people and also application for disabled pension was given.
- ◆ Two disabled girls learned sewing by joining skill development training. Along with this, they were also trained in capacity building and life skills which increased their confidence.
- ◆ Around 5 special job cards were made.
- ◆ Disabled pension were made of around 10 disabled people.

## SOCIAL

- Approx 30 PWD's freely participated in social and family activities.
- Around 28 PWD's along with freely participating in social and family activities, they also took their own decisions and conveyed their own message to the general public.



## EMPOWERMENT

- \* At the panchayat level, disabled people were also involved and their sayings were heard.
- \* Monthly meetings of 8 VDPO were being organized.
- \* Information about government schemes like disabled pension, old age pension, widow pension, Indira Awas Yojana, Jan Aadhaar Card scholarship etc. and employment opportunities like NREGA, open wages, daily wages, shop and self-employment was the main focus in the 8 DPO monthly meetings.
- \* RPWD Act was shared with people with disabilities so that people with disabilities could become aware of their rights.



# Rs. 5000 Cash Relief To Disabled People Program

All these activities were very affected by the pandemic but RSKS India team members did all the possible things like video calls, conference calls, whatsapp chat etc with the disabled or their family so that the bond between the RSKS Team and disabled beneficiaries will get strengthen. Also this helped RSKS team members to stay connected with the disabled during the corona lockdown and know their problems and try to solve their problems.

**Objective/ Goal :-** Disabled People faced many problems during the pandemic as the lockdown snatched away their and their family's employment which resulted in many troubles. So the objective/ goal of this program was to provide assistance to the disabled people to improve their health, education, employment and food security.

**Description:-** A normal person makes a living by employing according to his ability, but a disabled person has to face many difficulties in employment. In this pandemic the disabled people faced problems of ration, livelihood, education, health etc. In the Corona period, when so many Abled people were losing their employment, it was very difficult for the disabled people to do anything. In this harsh situation, Employment resources for unemployed people with disabilities were provided by the RSKS Organization.

## DISABILITY

The Organization selected 7 disabled people and they were given a check of Rs 5000 cash assistance for their health, education, employment and food security. Feedback of beneficiary disabled people was also taken by the organization. People with disabilities living in the lower strata of society found a solution to employment. People with disabilities bought goods for employment and started employment according to their needs. After this assistance they were able to purchase their food or medicines. These PWD were suffering a lot due to the corona pandemic so this cash assistance helped these people in many ways.



- Achievements:-**
- » The People with disabilities got some relief through the cash assistance provided by the RSKS India.
  - » Disabled people were able to purchase their medicines and ration for their family.
  - » Disabled people started their own employment to survive the pandemic and become self-reliant.

# Environment and Sanitation

## ADOPT A TREE; PROTECT ENVIRONMENT & EARTH

**Objectives or Goals:** - Everyone saw the importance of trees and oxygen in this pandemic so the goals/objectives of this program were to promote environmental protection through plantation and also to encourage people to plant trees through awareness programs.

**Description:-** RSKS India works for the environmental protection from the last many years as it is the most important thing to do as the effects of climate change could be seen all around the world and the corona pandemic which resulted in lack of oxygen is also an reason to understand why environmental protection is the necessary thing to do.

Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan team members conducted various types of awareness programs and tree plantation under this project. RSKS India planted approximately 450 fruitful and shady trees in 10 different inaccessible villages/locations. Also RSKS India worked with the local community to ensure the safety of these fruitful and shady trees.

Plantation work is done regularly by the organization and this year, more than 450 fruitful and shady saplings were planted by the RSKS organization in association with the local community and with the active participation of local people. RSKS India organizes awareness workshops in which the people are told about the importance of the trees and how they can protect us from many calamities.



- Achievements:-**
- » More than 450 fruitful and shady trees were planted this year.
  - » Environmental protection awareness was spread at 10 different villages/locations.
  - » Organized workshop for environmental protection which people supported.
  - » Small Support was provided towards environment conservation.
  - » Thousands of rural people got awareness about saving trees and planting trees.
  - » In the corona pandemic, we were able to increase the environmental oxygen.

## SAVE THE INNOCENT SPARROW BIRDS

**Purpose or Goal:** - The rapid growth of the world is leading to many problems and one of these problems is the decline in the population of sparrow birds so, Through this project, we have to save the sparrow bird and provide them a safe home and feeder so that the number of sparrow birds could increase.



# SAVE THE INNOCENT SPARROW BIRDS

**Description:** - In this evolving world, everyone is busy in building new buildings and continuously decreasing the forest areas which is resulting in the decline in the population of many flora and fauna. The sparrow bird is being counted among the endangered species as its number has decreased considerably. This project of RSKS India was being conducted for the protection of sparrow birds.

RSKS India conveys the message of sparrow bird protection through this project and to do this, sparrow houses and bird feeders were provided to bird lovers and were also installed at the public parks, mountains, hospitals, police stations etc. by

RSKS India to provide safe accommodation and safe food to the sparrow bird. This year, 235 bird houses were set up by RSKS India at government buildings, places like Parks, temples, monuments etc. where the Participation of local people was important in this program. The organization along with the local people installed sparrow houses and bird feeders.

On the demand of many bird lovers, RSKS India also provided sparrow bird house and bird feeder to them so that they could install it in their courtyard and play their part in protecting the innocent sparrow bird.

From time to time, RSKS India organizes awareness workshops at different areas where the conservation of sparrow birds and protecting the flora and fauna is told to the general public. RSKS India also checks the installed bird houses and bird feeders from time to time.

## Achievements:-

- 235 bird houses were set up to give safe accommodation to sparrow bird.
- 235 bird feeders were installed for sparrow bird.
- Sparrow bird houses were set up with local people and awareness workshops were also organized.
- Now increase in the number of sparrow birds could be seen.
- New sparrow birds were able to born in safe house installed by RSKS India.
- The sweet chirruping of sparrow birds could be heard at the places where the bird houses were installed.





# CHILD RIGHT AND WELFARE

**Objectives / Goals:** - Slum and street children are living a life very different from the mainstream society children so the objective/goal is to fulfill basic and important needs like health, education, nutrition of poor children of street, slums and disadvantaged sections, so that their standard of living can be improved. Also to provide them moment of happiness by celebrating festivals with them and providing them dresses, shoes etc.

**Description:** - Slum and street children are living a life very different from the mainstream society. They spend their time in collecting garbage or taking care of their siblings. Their parents have to struggle daily to provide them two times meal a day and in this pandemic when everything was closed these children started facing many problems as their parents lost their employment and they were totally dependent on others for their basic needs like food, clothes etc.

These children are also malnourished due to not eating proper nutritious food and also not eating two times a day due to their parent's poor financial condition. Poor children living in slums along the road live far away from basic needs like health, education and nutrition. It was often seen that they indulge in unethical acts like theft, begging etc to fulfill their basic needs. The main objective of this project was that by providing facilities like better health, education, nutrition to these poor children, they should be linked with the mainstream of the society.

RSKS India worked with these slum & street children by doing survey and finding the need of these children. More than 600 slum and street children were identified by the RSKS India team and then the RSKS Team organized many programs to provide basic facilities like health, education and nutrition. The following activities were organized by the organization this year:-



# Sports Discipline and Sacrament Camp:-

Children who are living nearby the roads and children of slums are always found collecting garbage from the area. Most of the times it is seen that, these children get involved in criminal activities like Chain snatching, burglary, use of abusive language etc. This happens due to Lack of discipline and moral values. They even do not play any sports. RSKS India targeted these particular type of children to lead them to a better path.

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RSKS India organized Sports, Discipline & Sacrament Camp for 440 children selected from 13 different slum/street areas. In these camps, children were taught Discipline & Sacrament by the means of sports activities. Along with this at end of the program, Biscuit, Rool, Pastry, Chocolate etc materials were distributed to these slum/street children.

All the children who came in these camps took oath that they will now never do criminal activities and will surely respect their elders. All the children took oath to always be honest and be in discipline. Parents of these children were very happy to see their children enjoying and understanding the Discipline & Sacrament.



## Proper Nutritional Diet and health awareness:-

Slum and street children always faces malnutrition due to poor financial condition of their family and this corona pandemic made the condition worse. A healthy child is able to do his daily tasks on his own and become self-sufficient.

All children need a balanced nutritious diet, right from childhood as it is required in the physical and mental development of the child. Conversely, there are some children who do not get nutritious and healthy food. Children living in the slums or streets of the city, whose parents themselves work as laborers, are even not able to get food for two times.

# Proper Nutritional Diet and health awareness:-



**RSKS India** organized health awareness camps along with nutritious food distribution program which included Black gram, Oatmeal, Chickpea lentil, Rice, Soya beans etc. All these healthy and nutritious food distribution work was done by RSKS India in the slum and street areas.

RSKS India organized 3 balanced nutrition material distribution and health awareness program with approx 1000 slum/street children at 34 slum/street locations. The nutritious food distribution contained nutritional food materials like gram, soyabean, pulses, chana-dal, moong - dal etc. Health checkup of these children was also done under this program, in which their weight and height were measured according to age.

In this program, slum and street children and their families were informed about balanced nutrition through flip charts, colour chart, stories, Video episodes etc. as proper nutrition is very important for these children to have a better health. Parents and children of all the slum area got knowledge of balanced nutrition and also learned nutritional requirements age by age.

All these children from slum & street got nutritious food to eat and their health improved as well as their parents have now knowledge about how to cook these nutritious foods for their children.

# Festivals Celebration With Sweets, Bakery Food & Warm Clothes: -

We could always find some poor children near road or streets collecting garbage or begging. These children are the ones who live at street or slum. These children work to have food for the night or take care of their siblings. Their childhood gets spend in all this. These children spend their life in tore, used or very old dresses. They live a very different life as compared to the mainstream children and are unable to celebrate any festivals. The situation of these children got worse in this pandemic. Their family didn't have money to spend on new dress for festivals due to poor financial condition. These children struggle to get two times food in a day when all the children from city are enjoying nutritious and tasty food along with new dresses at the time of festivals.



In this context, RSKS India took steps toward bringing happiness in their life at the time of festivals. RSKS India gave gift of happiness to these children on the occasion of Christmas Day, Dussehra etc. This year, these festivals of happiness brought happiness to these children also. RSKS India organized celebration at 18 different street/slum areas and gave new warm dresses like warm jacket, warm track pants and warm shoes to approx 500 street/slum children. Along with this biscuits, pastries, sweets etc were also distributed to these children.







## CHILD RIGHT AND WELFARE

Excitement in the eyes of street/slum children was easily seen during the distribution program. These children started dancing and singing and felt immense pleasure and joy by wearing the new warm dresses.

These children also felt like they are same as the children living in the cities because on this happiness festival they are also having new dresses to wear, bakery items and sweets to eat and celebrate. Happiness returned to the faces of these slum and street children once again because all this was just a dream for these children,

which RSKS turned into reality. Also through these warm clothes these children will be able to protect themselves from the harsh cold climate.

# "Diwali" Party Wear Dresses Distribution

Every child wants to wear a new dress while getting ready for the festival of lights "Diwali" or sometimes in a year but the slum and street children do not get this opportunity and wear torn dresses throughout the year and on Diwali Festival. For the children living at the roadside and slum, the desire for new dress remains incomplete. To fulfill the unfulfilled desire of such poor children,

RSKS India organized New party wear dress distribution program for slum and street children in which Sherwani, Indo-western, Lehnga-Chunri and Sweets were distributed to the Slum, Street, Marginalized, Poor and Deprived Children.



## "Diwali" Party Wear Dresses Distribution

The program was conducted by RSKS Organization with approx 600 children of 22 different slum/ street areas. These children included both girls and boys in which girls were given anarkali, lehenga, frock etc. dress and boys were given jeans, T-shirt, pants, sherwani etc. Along with this sweet boxes and food packets were also given to these children. On seeing the new dress, the faces of every slum and street children blossomed and there was no place for their happiness. The wish of these children of wearing a new dress got fulfilled. Seeing the happiness of these children, their family members were also happy. This program gave a hope to these children that everything is okay and things can change someday.



# SAFE MOTHERHOOD

**Purpose or goal:** - Safe Motherhood is the most important work as it is a matter of two lives and deciding of present and future. So the goal/objective of this project is that Women should get the right to health services with safe motherhood.

**Description:** - Pregnancy is a phase of life of a woman which is very crucial for her and her baby. It determines the present and future of the family and also it is a thing which is connected with two lives so Every woman should get better health facility during pregnancy and also balanced nutrition. So for this, RSKS India made women aware through different type of workshops in different villages under this project of RSKS India.

RSKS India made women aware through workshops in 51 villages on safe motherhood in order to create healthy newborn baby. Many types of problems arose due to lack of care of woman while her pregnancy. Apart from this, information about family planning was also given to women through the workshop. Women in rural areas do not have complete information at the time of conception and due to this it leads to the death of a newborn child. In order to prevent this, regular follow-up of pregnant women was being taken by the Anganwadi teachers after the encouragement from RSKS India.

- Achievements:-**
- » Organized 51 workshops on safe motherhood and health awareness in 51 inaccessible villages, which made women aware.
  - » Safety and nutrition information was given during pregnancy.
  - » Openly discussion was done on family planning.



# BE FREE; BE SMILE; BE HEALTHY

**Objective:** - Menstrual health is very important for women as if not taken care of it could result in getting cancer or any other health problems so the objective/goal of this program is to provide information about menstrual health to women and young girls of inaccessible village and to encourage the use of sanitary napkins for safe menstruation.

**Description:** - Menstrual health is very important for women as if not taken care of it could result in getting cancer or any other health problems. In the corona period when there was lockdown in the whole country, it resulted in many problems to young girls and women living in the rural areas as the shops were closed and rural girls and women had to travel a lot to purchase sanitary napkins.

Even today, women and young girls in rural areas use traditional resources such as cloth, cotton, newspaper during menstruation. Because of this, women have to face many types of diseases and infections. RSKS India is working to spread awareness on this sensitive issue. RSKS India encouraged women to use sanitary napkins and make menstruation safe through workshops done at 51 villages.

2033 girls and women of 51 different villages/locations were given 4 pads packets each and each packet contained 10 sanitary napkins i.e. total of 81,320 sanitary napkins were distributed by RSKS India in the 51 workshops about safe menstrual health this year. This encouraged the use of sanitary napkins during the menstrual period. Women and young girls became aware about safe menstrual health by joining this program and are now using sanitary napkins during their periods.



**Achievements:-**

- Through awareness activity of this project, more than 2000 women benefited and became aware.
- 81,320 sanitary napkins were distributed through the year.
- Women were informed about menstrual health through more than 50 workshops.
- The program emphasized the use of sanitary napkins and conveyed habit change.
- Safe menstrual health was being promoted in the inaccessible rural and remote areas.
- RSKS India was able to provide sanitary napkins at the village/location of the women in the corona pandemic.



# KILL MALARIA, SAVE HUMAN LIFE

**Objective:** - The corona pandemic took so many lives worldwide but there are other diseases like malaria, dengue which also takes many lives every year so the objective of this program was to spread awareness about global epidemic malaria as well as to provide better health to the people living in slum colonies.

**Description:** - The corona pandemic took so many lives worldwide but there are other diseases like malaria, dengue which also takes many lives every year. Malaria is a global disease that shows its effects all over the world every year. It is a mosquito-borne disease that spreads more in the dirty area and people living in slum and street habitat are more affected by this disease because the dirt is spread around the slum area.

RSKS India selected these types of slums and conducted awareness activities against malaria over there. RSKS India selected many street & slum settlements in the city and organized the workshop there. In this workshop, the entire slums and street was cleaned along with the residents and the dirty water was removed.

After this, Mosquito nets were distributed by the RSKS India to people living in mosquito-affected areas. Mosquito nets were distributed by the RSKS Organization to more than 100 families who live in the mosquito effective area. With the use of mosquito nets, they were able to sleep peacefully and without any fear and were able to protect themselves from the deadly mosquito diseases like dengue, malaria etc.

**Achievements:-**

- Awareness programs were organized in many urban slums.
- Mosquito nets were distributed to more than 100 families.
- Cleanliness campaign was organized in the slum area by RSKS India.
- Slum and street people got protection against deadly diseases like malaria and dengue.



# T.B. MDR & XDR Patients Relief

## [Protein Food distribution program]

**Objective:** - It is very necessary for a T.B. MDR & XDR patient to eat healthy nutritious food in order to recover from the disease but some people who belong to lower strata or the people who lost their employment due to the corona pandemic are not able to eat healthy nutritious food, so the objective of this program was to provide better health and protein content to the people belonging to the lower classes suffering from T.B. MDR & XDR.

**Description:** - Tuberculosis (T.B.) is a potentially serious infectious disease that mainly affects the lungs and to recover from it the person has to take proper medication along with healthy nutritious food. Mainly there are T.B. MDR & XDR patients and the suffering person has to face many types of difficulties. In this disease, the person starts losing weight and gets weak day by day, so protein rich food is required to that person and is also prescribed by the doctors but some people who belong to lower strata or the people who lost their employment due to the corona pandemic are not able to eat healthy nutritious food.





In this context, RSKS India gave helping hand to TB MDR & XDR patients and provided them healthy nutritious food to them for free. The patients with protein dietary content were able to recover from the disease. RSKS India distributed regular protein rich diet to 45 TB MDR patients every month which included Soyabean, Dal, Chana Dal, Moong Dal, Egg Tray, Milk, etc. The intake of major protein content increased their weight and made them healthy.

**Achievements:-**

- ▶ 45 T.B. MDR & XDR patients got relief of healthy food during covid-19.
- ▶ Regular follow-up and health checkup of 45 TB MDR patients was done.
- ▶ Distribution of protein rich food items every month to 45 patients was done.
- ▶ Increase in weight of patients was seen and they became healthy.



# FREE DENTAL HEALTH CAMP

**Objective:-** Many rural people are not aware about Dental health and this is the reason they do not take care of their dental problems and do not go to a dentist for treatment and this result in proper decay of their teeths, gums etc. So, the objective of this program was to aware people about dental health. Also to solve the dental problems of rural people as they do not go to dentist.

**Description:-** Rural people are having too many dental problems but they do not have any dentist at their nearby places and they do not come to city for a checkup because they find it expensive and wastage of time. They live with the dental problems and it causes so many oral problems and also diseases like cancer but still they find it useless to go to a dentist until and unless they have some major oral problem.



In order to solve this problem, RSKS India organized free dental health checkup camp in a rural village area. This camp was organized at the village government building with the support of village official and it was free for all the rural children, men and women. Free dental checkup along with medicines were given for free to the rural children, men and women. Through the help of this free dental health checkup camp, rural people were able to tell their dental problems to dentist and got their solution for free. The children and women who were unable to go to the dentist in city because of far away and financial problems were able to get their dental checkup in their village only.

**Achievements:-**

- 1] Dental remedies of around 105 rural people got solved through this program.
- 2] Rural community people and their family members got to know about dental health.
- 3] Dental Check was done of the rural community people for free.

## CAMPAIGN AND ADVOCACY

### Celeberating Festival & Social Days

**Purpose or goal:** The campaign and advocacy is done to aware community people, while making the community a participant in celebrating the festival or spreading awareness on any social topic and organizing the activities and spreading the importance of social day to the people.

**Description:** - Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan RSKS India respects all religions and makes/celebrates all festivals and social days coming from time to time with great interest amongst the community. This year when corona pandemic spread fear among the community people it was very important to celebrate festivals to have some moments of fun among the community.

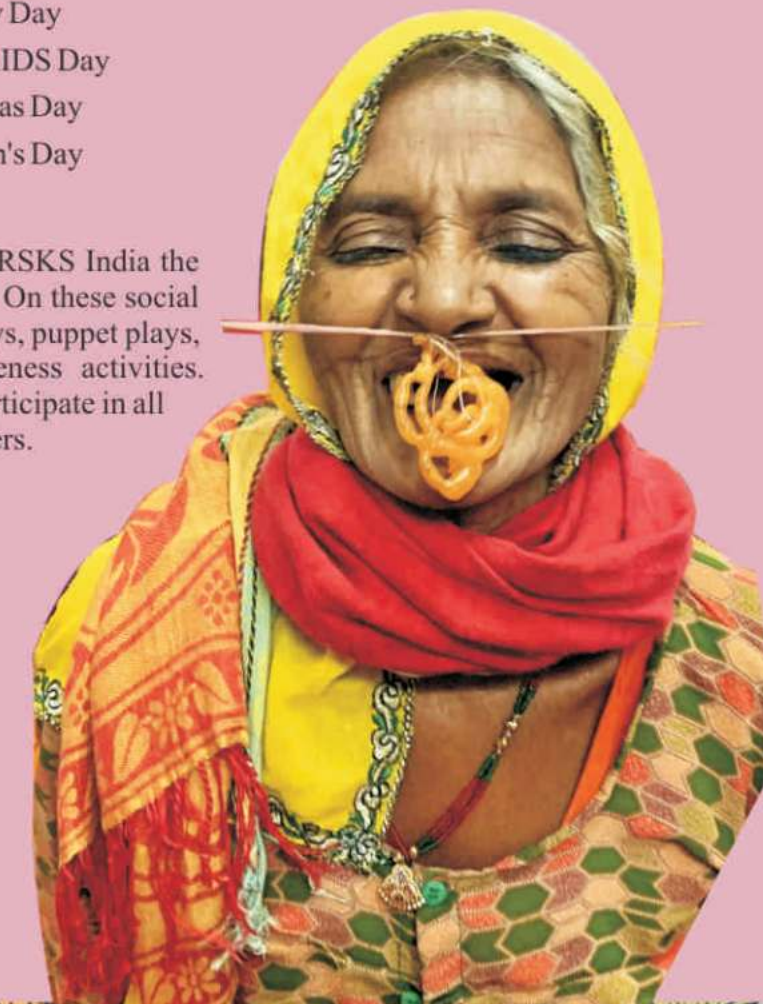

- ▶ Winners were encouraged by prizes in all the contests.







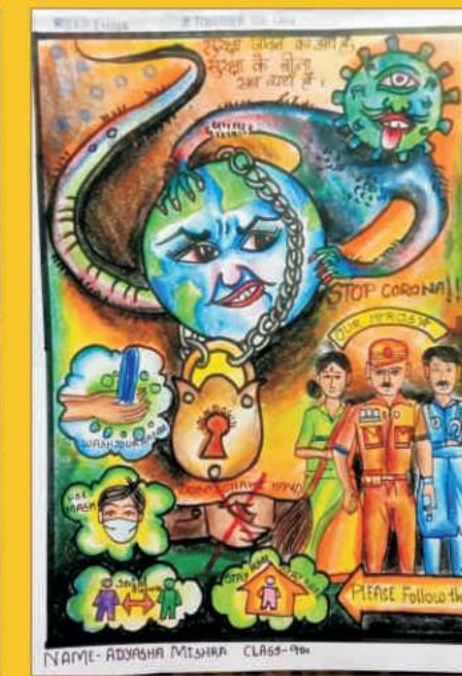
# Together We Can Campaign

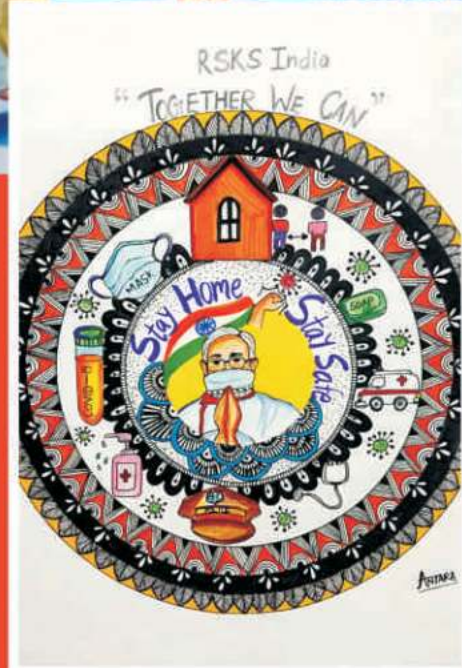

The "Together we can" campaign included the following competitions:-

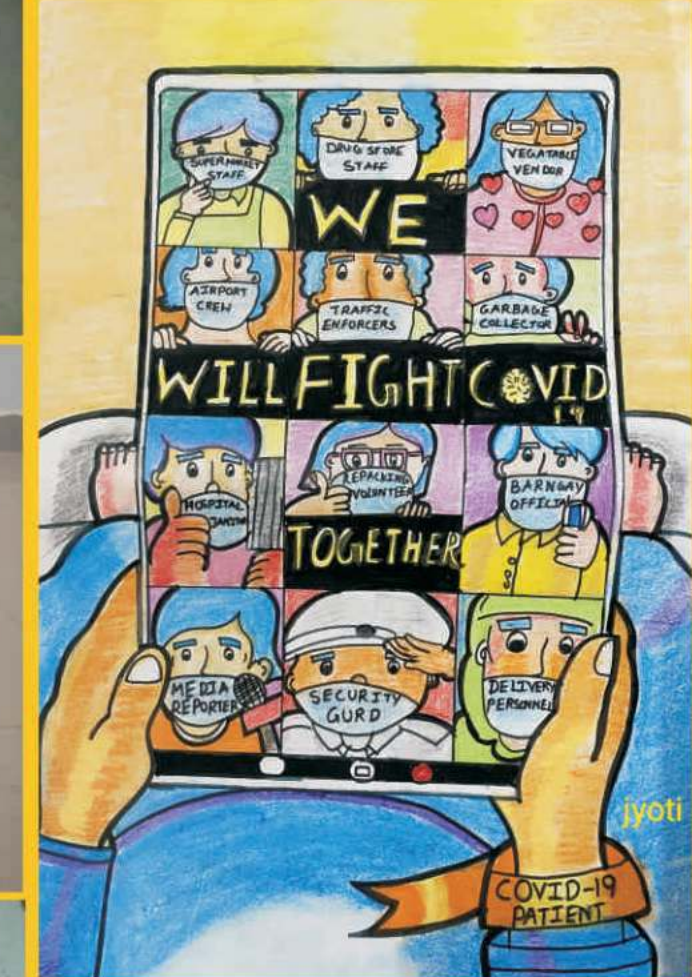

# DISASTER RELIEF RECOVERY AND MANAGEMENT

## Novel Corona Virus Pandemic

**R**SKS India as an NGO is for the community and so is always there for the community whenever there is any requirement. In this context, RSKS India always stands for the support of the community at the time of disaster to spread humanity, whether it be the flood in Kerala or an earthquake in Nepal or a severe flood in western Rajasthan.

RSKS India provides relief to the people in danger or the people in need and does relief work with full determination at the time of any disaster. The novel corona virus also known as Covid-19, engulfed the whole world and showed its devastating effects but RSKS India team with full determination towards its work organized the Together We Can Against Covid-19 Campaign under which many programs were done in order to provide relief to the community.



All of these programs were first identified through baseline and then the relief work was done. RSKS team members were involved in relief work while fulfilling moral duty. This work was being done in a phased manner by the organization which included many programs. All the work done by the RSKS India in the period of covid-19 disaster is as follows:-

## Covid-19 Awareness Through Wall Paintings and Other Awareness Activities

Everyone in the whole world could protect themselves from the covid-19 by following all the covid-19 safety protocols but there were many people living in inaccessible rural areas who did not even knew about the corona and its safety measures. So to spread awareness RSKS India went on to work effectively with full security and continued the awareness work but in some different way.

These ways were creating around 120 wall paintings in different villages so that the rural people living in the village and the passerby could know about the covid-19 and its safety protocols. Along with this RSKS India did awareness activities like puppet shows, story-telling, workshop, etc with the rural, marginalized and deprived community and spread direct awareness to approx 2500 people. The team of RSKS informed about safety, security and precaution from Covid-19 through these activities and also explained the importance of cleanliness and gave people a message to stay safe at home.





# Covid-19 Ration/ Grocery Kit & Hygiene Kit Distribution program



Due to the increase in the covid-19 positive cases the whole country was set up under a lock down which in turn resulted in many problems to all strata of people living in the country. One of the biggest problem which the people started to face was lack of ration at their house and because of this many people started panicking and went to shops and purchased more and more but there were many people belonging to lower strata, families like of disabled, effigy makers, folk artist, migrant labours, daily wages earner, nomadic, deprived families etc who were unable to get two times meal a day. Also these people were not having any hygiene kit to protect themselves from the novel corona virus.



In this context, RSKS India started its Covid-19 Ration/ Grocery Kit Distribution program under which flour, rice, spices, vegetable, lentils, oil, sugar, salt, etc other ration/grocery materials were distributed for free to 4630 families which means it benefitted around 19,000 people who were the members of these 4630 families. These 4630 families got 4630 ration/grocer kits which were of approx 30 kg and were sufficient for securing the food security of the 4630 families for approx 4-5 weeks. Along with the ration/grocery kit, RSKS India also distributed hygiene kit to these 4630 families which included cloth masks, soap, sanitizer, sanitary napkins etc. Through this hygiene kit, these families and their family members were able to protect themselves from the novel corona virus. This program was done throughout the year and approx 300 locations/ villages were found through baseline survey for this distribution work. Keeping in mind the covid-19 safety protocols, all of this work was done by RSKS Team by wearing mask, ensuring social distancing and using of sanitizers or doing hand wash whenever needed. After the distribution their feedbacks were also taken to improve the program in future and also know about the area where we could work upon.





# Cloth Mask Sewing & Distribution Program



**H**ow the people can protect themselves from covid-19? The answer was by taking proper precaution and the first thing to do was wearing mask. So for this, The Rural girls and women living in village also wish to become self-reliant but their community and not proper education or skill make them do nothing and only do household works.

During the time of lock down due to covid-19, so many rural families started facing financial problems because many people living in villages are daily wages labour or farmer and due to lock down they had to sit unemployed at home. After understanding all these problems from the ground, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan and team found an unique solution to this problem. RSKS India conducted motivation sessions on ground with the rural community girls and

women who were the past beneficiaries of RSKS vocation trainings and also to women and girls who wished to support their family but were unable to. This motivation session was about preparing cloth-made masks.

After this, these rural girls and women were able to make cloth made masks perfectly. These rural girls and women were able to prepare 5031 masks and they also distributed these in 35 different village, slum and street areas. All the girls and women from the training got very happy as they prepared the masks which got them earnings and they were able to become self reliant. The rural, street and slum people who got these cloth made masks were able to protect themselves from this pandemic and also follow the covid-19 safety protocols.





# Covid-19 Health Workers, Security Workers Hygiene Kit Distribution Program



Covid-19 pandemic emerged as a crisis all over the world, all countries have come in its grip and the infection spread so fast that the people did not get a chance to recover. During this pandemic there were some people who did not worry about their lives. They were protecting the people by performing their duties, these included health workers, sanitation workers, media people, security & police personnel, and hygiene people.

In this context, RSKS India distributed hygiene kits and medical kits to approx 2000 health workers, sanitation workers, media people, security & police personnel at 71 locations. This Hygiene kit included small and big sanitizer bottle, masks, hand gloves, safety shields etc. hygiene material.

With the help of Hygiene kit provided by the RSKS India, these people are able to do their jobs safely. These health workers, sanitation workers, media people, security & police personnel regularly used the masks, hand gloves, safety shields etc. provided by the organization to protect themselves from this pandemic and not face any shortage of these equipments.

## Covid-19 Hygiene Kit, Sandals, Fruits Distribution Program (Migrant Labour)



During the Covid-19 pandemic, the whole country was locked down. All the people were in captivity at their homes in order to be safe but there were some people who lived in other cities for livelihood and employment. These migrant laborers were stuck in other cities, these migrant laborers had neither money nor food in such a situation, they left home with their family and had to travel on foot due to lack of transportation in lockdown.

In this harsh time, RSKS India extended the helping hand to such migrant laborers and small relief materials such as slippers, fruits, masks and hygiene kit etc. were distributed to 235 migrant laborers under the Covid-19 Hygiene Kit, Sandals, Fruits Distribution Program at 3 different locations. The nutritious fruits given by the RSKS India kept these migrants healthy during their journey and provided nutrients and proteins and also the sandals or slippers helped them in their way to home as they were walking bare foot earlier.



**Covid-19 Needy, Homeless, Marginalized, Slum, Poor People Cooked Food Distribution Program**

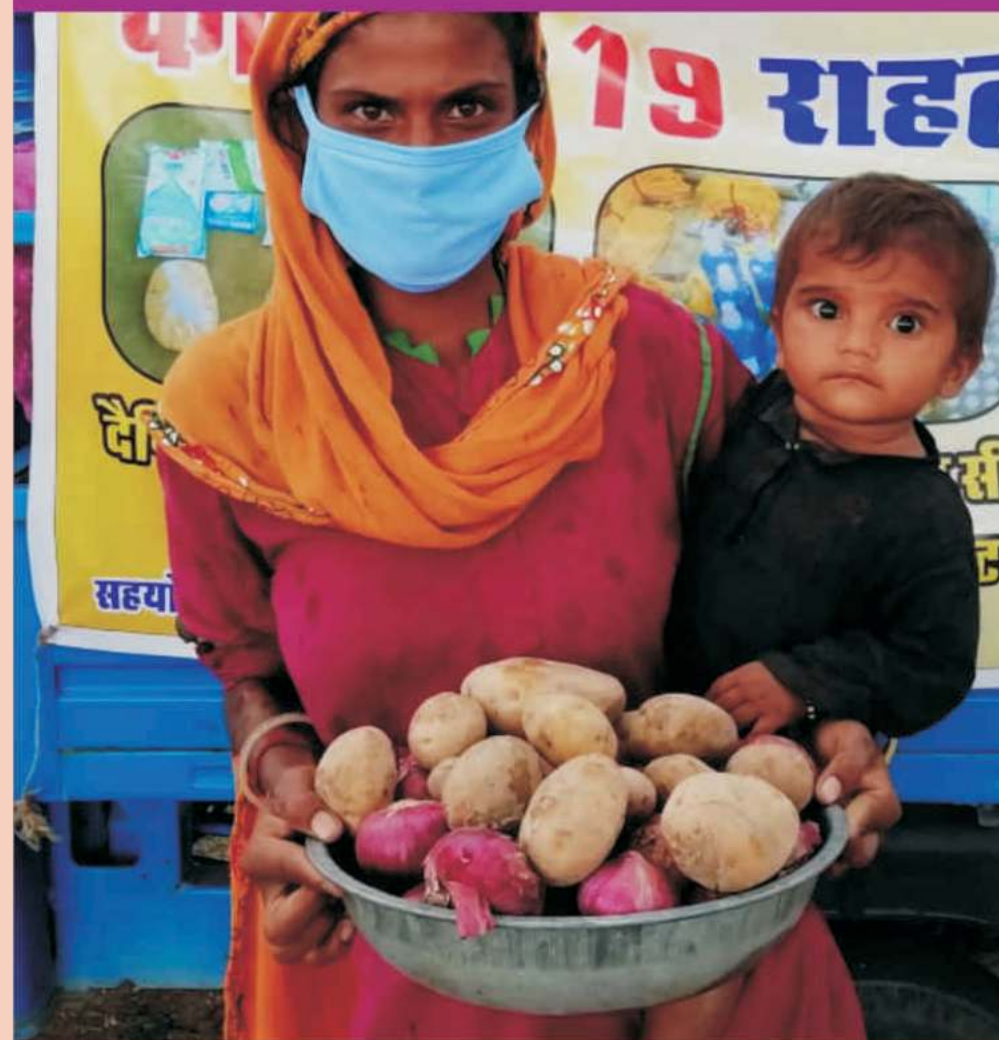


Covid-19 pandemic came along with so many problems to deal with and the biggest one was hunger. The people who were dependent on daily wages or the people who did not have a huge savings were affected by this pandemic the most. The people living in slums or streets were also craving for food. The needy, homeless, marginalized and poor people were unable to eat two times meal a day due to the lockdown.

In this critical situation, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan came forward to help and supported all the people who were in dire need of food and distributed cooked food packets to them under the Covid-19 Needy, Homeless, Marginalized, Slum, Poor People Cooked Food Distribution Program. These Food packets were given to 987 beneficiaries for 4 times so the total food packets given were 3948. The Needy, Homeless, Marginalized, Slum and Poor People got food to eat for two times a day. They were sleeping hungry earlier but due to the Covid-19 Needy, Homeless, Marginalized, Slum, Poor People Cooked Food Distribution Program they got a balanced diet food and were able to sleep with full stomach.



**Potato, Onion And Mask Distribution Program**



Slum and street people living nearby or inside the city were not treated good and due to the covid-19 pandemic, mainstream society people are neglecting them as they thought that they will catch the virus if they will go nearby to these slum or street people. The problem of eating started coming, in such a situation, these people were sitting with their eyes on any donor, when someone gave food, they were able to eat otherwise they have to stay hungry.

RSKS India planned to extend a helping hand to such people by marking 4 slum areas of the city and distributed 560 kg onions, 560 kg potatoes and 280 masks under the Potato, Onion And Mask Distribution Program by which these people were able to revive their kitchen. With the regular use of masks distributed, these people were able to protect themselves from the pandemic and keep their family safe.



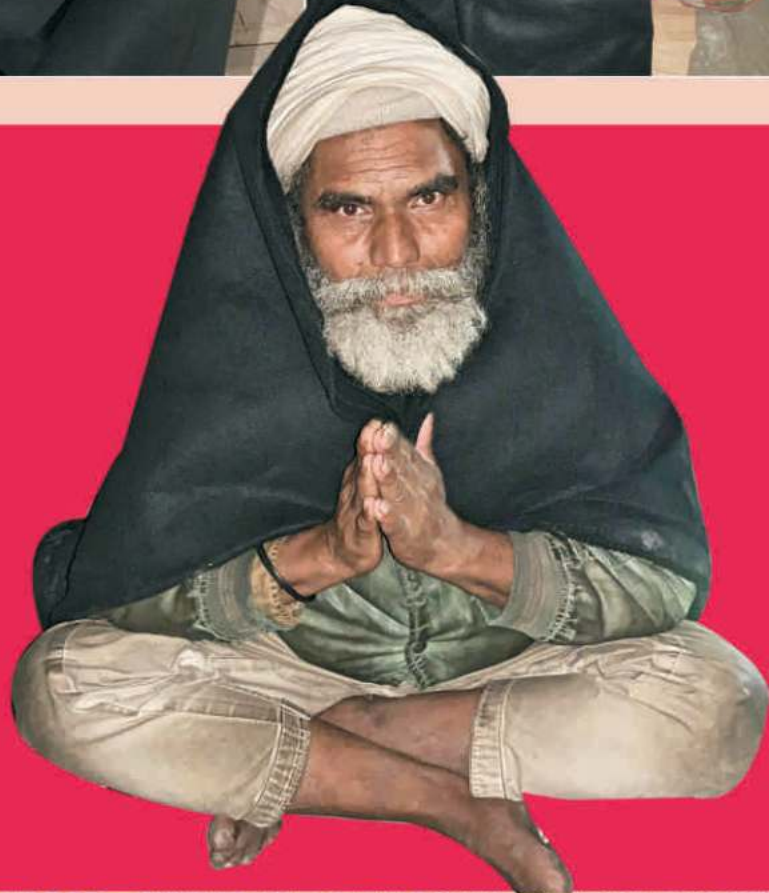
# Warm Blanket Distribution To Poor, Street And Nomadic People



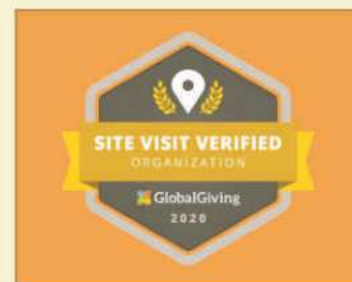

RSKS India watching all these problems closely, distributed Warm Blankets to these homeless, poor, street and nomadic people under to program “Warm Blanket Distribution To Poor, Street And Nomadic People”. In this program, warm blankets were distributed to 225 homeless, poor, street and nomadic people at approx 35 different places. “Warm Blanket Distribution To Poor, Street And Nomadic People” Program gave warmth in the cold weather to the homeless, street, poor and nomadic people. These people started believing in humanity and were able to protect themselves from the cold weather.

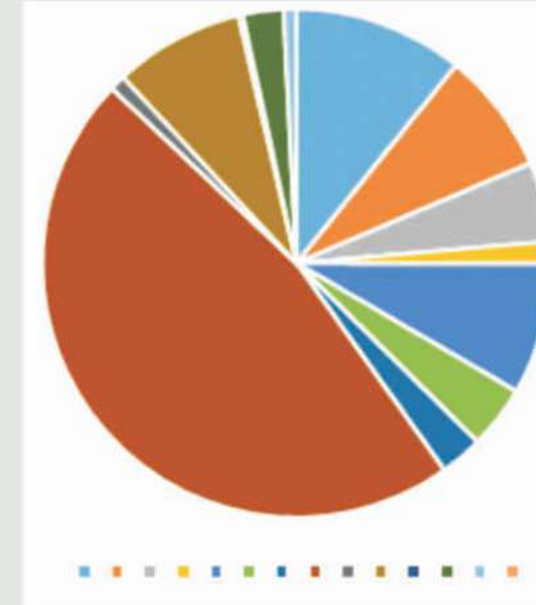

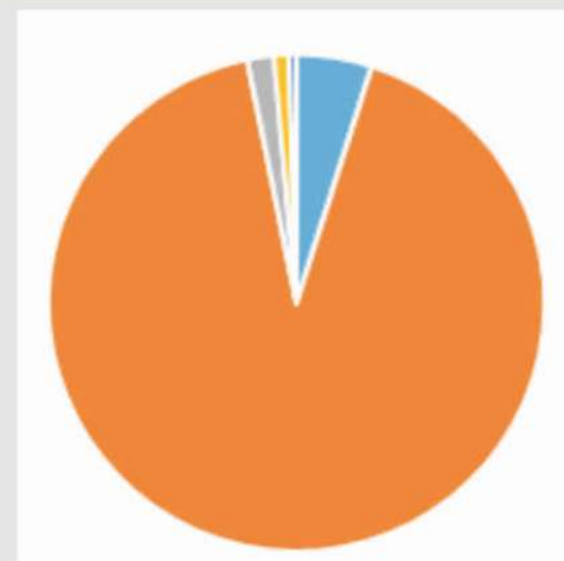
