International Armored Group (IAG) is a quality conscious armored vehicle manufacturer with over 25 years of experience specializing in the fields of design, engineering, prototyping and manufacturing of armored commercial and tactical vehicles. We have grown substantially over the years and have become one of the most technologically advanced armored vehicle manufacturers in the world.

IAG's core competency is the ability to engineer and design vehicle armoring solutions providing optimal survivability and reliability, while maintaining superior driving dynamics and performance.

International Armored Group was the **FIRST** company in the world to have tested and successfully certified the all new Toyota Land Cruiser 300 series. The IAG certified VR7 TLC 300 has been tested under the latest VPAM standards for vehicle ballistic and blast resistance. This certification is a testament to IAG's prowess and engineering know-how in the manufacturing of armored vehicles and solidifies IAG's position as an industry leader and pioneer. Others may follow but there could only be one who was first.

Despite years 2020, 2021, and 2022 being tremendously challenging for the global economy as well as for the industry IAG operates in, no challenge has ever hindered IAG from constantly innovating its technological capabilities. In 2021 one more time IAG became the first company in the world to obtain BRV2009 VR7 for Toyota Land Cruiser 300. And in 2022, IAG manufactured and supplied numerous Armored Toyota Land Cruiser 300 vehicles to support various Peacekeeping Operations and Missions in conflict zones.

In 2021 IAG tested and certified a brand new tactical vehicle platform to STANAG 4569 Level 4 which is considered the lightest vehicle in its class to receive such a certificate. Keeping up with our policies to cultivate innovation and modern technology, in 2022 IAG manufactured and unveiled the Rila 8x8 IFV (Infantry Fighting Vehicle) - a new generation of combat vehicles combining high levels of mobility, protection, and firepower. About this Report

This report spans the period between December 2021 and December 2022. IAG has been publishing such reports every year since 2009 to reach out to our stakeholders in a transparent and accessible way.

The war in Ukraine has left millions of civilians unable to return home, creating the fastest displacement crisis in Europe since World War II. The majority of those displaced are women and children - most at risk of exploitation and abuse during crises. Many still in the country lack access to critical care. Human Rights Principles

Assessment, Policy and Goals

At International Armored Group (herein “IAG”) we are serious about our responsibility towards our employees, our partners, and to society. Our pledge to safeguard human rights is rooted in our business operations.

We embrace new challenges by investing in ourselves for personal growth, and through continuous creativity with a spontaneous attitude. We respect and value our people, and optimize their capabilities through fostering culture and diversity. To achieve our goals, we always act with integrity and shared ethics utilizing a collaborative effort focused on friendly communication.

We consider our employees to be the most important stakeholders and in striving to further promote and strengthen various existing measures, including health management, we create a workplace where productivity and motivation can be enhanced.

IAG works with the highest integrity, compliance culture and respect for human rights while also reducing the footprint of our technology and environmental impact. We believe that the incorporation of internationally recognized human rights standards into our business practices improves worker morale and results in a higher quality working environment and higher quality products.

IAG promotes respect for fundamental human rights. Collaborating with expert stakeholders locally and globally is integral to IAG’s human rights principles. We expect all stakeholders, including business partners, vendors and suppliers, to be aligned in upholding human rights globally.

IAG respects the rights of human beings in accordance with the UN guidelines, government laws of each respective country where IAG operates, and moral principles that guide company’s business operations. We believe that long-term business success can only be achieved if human rights are acknowledged and protected.

We believe in our responsibility to respect and support internationally proclaimed human rights, and we will constantly strive to make sure that we are not complicit in human rights abuses of any individuals we are in contact with directly or indirectly.

At IAG we strive to attract the best candidates and work hard to retain our employees. Striving to be an employer of choice, we place value on creating a culture of learning, promoting diversity, and fostering equality.

Our global community includes people of diverse ethnicities, colours, religions, socio-economic backgrounds, and a range of other human differences. We understand that fostering a culture of respect and inclusion creates a dynamic and happy workforce. We believe that everyone should be treated fairly and with respect, regardless of their ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender, age, disability, status, or professional background.

With respect to gender, we seek to foster women leaders in our senior global roles but we are also focusing on ensuring that women are leaders of our most significant client relationships. We are committed to the protection of women's rights.

IAG is committed to fostering diversity – be in terms of skills, ethnicity, cultural background. Diversity makes us, as a company, stronger, ensuring a variety of perspectives, expertise and experience.

We encourage all employees to raise concerns about inappropriate conduct, including potentially unethical or illegal conduct, while assuring confidentiality or any form of harassment. Employees are able to raise their concerns via their respective manager or human resources business partner.

At IAG, we believe in open and fair dialogue with all our stakeholders and commit to communicating effectively with external parties, ensuring there is trusted and accessible consultation mechanism available.

IAG regularly confronts complex human rights challenges in its various businesses and throughout the world. We also support efforts to prevent the global pandemic of forced labour in our operations and those of our supply chain.

Due to the international travel restrictions, many of our employees were stranded abroad on project assignments. IAG responded to this with campaigning to return employees all over the world. Due to our continuous compliance with local rules and regulations, we did not have to close any of our production plants. However, we implemented specific internal rules in order to meet the health treat in most adequate way that represent quick and targeted response to COVID-19 pandemic tailored to local situations in order to guarantee employee health and safety.

Our activities affect directly and indirectly huge number of people. We are aware of the responsibilities resulting from this global impact; hence the constant tries to ensure respect of human rights in our activities worldwide. We are aware that this is a core element of responsible business conduct and therefore an integral part of our business. We work to address key issues relevant to our sector, business activity and supply chains including: modern slavery and exploitative labour practices, child labour, all forms of discrimination, fair wages, working hours and conditions, health, and safety, right to freedom of association.

IAG's commitment to performing with integrity is instilled in every employee as a non-negotiable expectation of behaviour which is underscored by an extensive system of policies, processes, training and communications.

Additionally, IAG's employees are encourages to raise integrity concerns and to feel confident that they can do so without fear of retaliation. IAG's employees remain our first and best line of defence in the early detection of potential compliance issues.

As part of IAG continued efforts to respect the applicable Universal Declaration of Human Rights, extensive efforts have been made to ensure all aspects of IAG's policies and goals are following these standards.

As a professional product manufacturer with such an eminent history, we judge that our prime human rights-related risks and opportunities lie in our relationships with our stakeholders, and above all, with our employees. Our developed due diligence processes provide more insight to help identify risks and ensure we understand the best approaches to preventing and mitigating risks to our people.

IAG is an Equal Opportunity Employer and has adopted the following policy:

- IAG focuses on training plans to educate employees about the risks and policies they need to be aware of. Such learning is reinforced via leadership communications and embedded messaging within various applications.
- IAG's Integrity and Compliance Program focuses on personal engagement from IAG's leadership and is supported by robust compliance processes. IAG leaders across the businesses personally drive a culture of integrity everywhere IAG operates.
- We regard the ten principles of United Nations Global Compact as binding for the entire company and therefore, we expect from our employees, suppliers and business partners worldwide to recognize and apply the ten principles.
- IAG has implemented audit and management review which are carried out on an annual basis and are an integral part of IAG's policies.
- IAG stands committed to its philosophy that all employees are entitled to equal employment opportunities. This policy applies to all personnel actions, including compensation, benefits, discipline, transfers, promotions, lay-offs, leaves of absence, terminations, and participation in IAG-administered activities.
- IAG also affirmatively recruits and hires individuals based upon demonstrated abilities, achievements and experience, without regard to race, color, religion, age, national origin or ancestry, sex, pregnancy, citizenship status, marital status, physical or mental disability, medical conditions, sexual orientation, or any other consideration made unlawful by UAE laws.
- IAG does not tolerate, nor condone abuse of human rights within any part of our business or supply chains, and we will take any allegations of abuse seriously. As part of this we work to ensure effective provision of remedy wherever human rights occur through company-based grievance mechanisms.

It is the responsibility of all employees to ensure IAG's policy of equal employment opportunity is implemented in all phases of human resources administration. Violation of this policy by any employee will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination. To comply with applicable laws ensuring equal employment opportunities to qualified individuals with a disability, IAG will make reasonable accommodations for the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified individual with a disability who is an applicant or an employee, unless undue hardship to IAG would result.

Any applicant or employee who requires an accommodation to perform the essential functions of the job should contact their supervisor or Human Resources representative and request such an accommodation. The individual with the disability should specify what accommodation he or she needs to perform the job. IAG will then investigate to identify the barriers that make it difficult for the applicant or employee to have an equal opportunity to perform his or her job. IAG will identify possible accommodation, if any, which will help eliminate the limitation. If the accommodation is reasonable and would not impose an undue hardship, IAG will make the accommodation.

We do not tolerate harassment in the workplace, we are committed to maintain healthy and safe work environment in all offices. Dangerous, abusive or violent behavior, or the threat of such behavior, is prohibited and will not be tolerated. We're committed to providing equal opportunities for all employees, eliminating all discriminatory practices and promoting a work environment that is free from harassment, violence and intimidation.

We believe everyone should be treated fairly regardless of their race, gender, economic status, ethical background, sexual orientation, age, political beliefs or any other comparable characteristics, and therefore we prohibit discrimination, harassment, forced labour and child labour.

It is against IAG policy for any employee, male or female, to harass another employee, based on an individual's race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin or ancestry, citizenship status, marital status, pregnancy, age, medical condition, handicap or disability. IAG policy defines "sexual harassment" to mean any conduct, comment, gesture or contact of a sexual nature (a) that is likely to cause offence or humiliation to any employee; or (b) that might, on reasonable grounds, be perceived by that employee as placing a condition of a sexual nature on employment or on any opportunity for training or promotion".

IAG's policy against improper payments and presents in business transactions is a key element in our integrity policy. Our employees are able to make an anonymous report if they suspect that an IAG employee is engaged in unacceptable or inappropriate conduct in relation to human rights or any other ethical issue.

With changing workforce demographics and model of communication, our program required constant reinvention to stay relevant for a global community. IAG relies on key controls and input from regional experts to ensure compliance is achieved everywhere.

We are committed to developing the talents and skills of our people, and we actively promote a culture of learning within the company. Employees are encouraged to expand their knowledge and expertise throughout their careers.

In addition to respecting human rights and fair labor practices in our company, we believe that one of the most significant contribution we can make is through the support of local communities and their initiatives. Just an example is our commitment to a local Pilipino volleyball club for which we have expressed our support, not only financially but also moral.

We take legal advice in the local jurisdiction we operate in about human rights compliance and require managers across IAG to comply with all company policies. Employment contracts are reviewed for compliance in each local jurisdiction and we seek compliance with our policies and contract through governance and management structure.

We believe that working with suppliers will enable us to identify projects that will have both operational and environmental benefits while building stronger relationships and reducing our supply chain costs.

Suppliers are critical partners in IAG's value chain. As IAG's business has globalized so has our supply chain, including in locations where environment, health, safety, labour and human rights practices can be very challenging. We expect our suppliers to obey the laws that require fair treatment of workers, a safe and healthy work environment, and environmental protection.

Outcome

Since the last COP report in 2021, our company has not received any human rights complaints nor

have been documented for any violations. No fines related to human rights issues have been levied against the company by any governmental organization since the formation of the company.

Objectives

Through our policy of inclusion, we aim to encourage and develop:

- Increase the supply of ethically sourced labour by creating an enabling environment and supporting the development and implementation of systems to identify and use ethical recruitment agencies.
- A workplace environment that encourage high-quality performance and individual engagement as a function of diverse teams.
- Create demand for responsible recruitment by raising awareness about the positive benefits of ethical practices.
- To treat people fairly, with dignity and pursue equality of opportunity and inclusion for all employees through our employment policies and practices.
- To observe no human rights abuses within areas of operation and to show zero tolerance towards such abuses.
- To recruit, select and develop our people on merit – irrespective of their age, race, colour, origin, gender, religious beliefs, disability, family or marital status, sexual orientation or other prohibited grounds.
- To report any human rights abuses detected within suppliers, subcontractors or clients' operations.
- A work environment of transparency and trust which compensates employees competitively and operates in compliance with applicable wage, work hours, overtime
- A company with rich diversity in ethnicity, nationalities, gender, culture, and religions.
- An attractive image as a company that welcomes people who think differently.

This statement applies to all our internal stakeholders in all locations where IAG operates. We will implement human rights due diligence into our operating mode and instruct our team members to comply with this policy. We also consider social, ethical and environmental considerations in our procurement and supply chain decisions.

We believe working on human rights is a journey that constantly evolves and changes depending on emerging legislation, best practices, and world events. Therefore, we are investigating different methods available to businesses to drive forward change within our business and across the armored vehicles' manufacturing sector to ensure continuous improvement; such as expanding our supplier due diligence.

A hallmark of our compliance program is a steadfast commitment to a vibrant, well- publicized and effective transparent reporting environment.

Labor Principles

Assessment, Policy and Goals

IAG is committed to pursuing the objectives of the leading international initiatives designed to promote human rights and sustainable development, including the United Nations Global Compact and the United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights.

IAG's compliance and integrity culture places the company in an excellent position to pursue and perform work compliantly with governments and government contractors. We do not rely solely on our culture but we continue to emphasize with our employees and executives the importance of our policies.

IAG promotes respect for fundamental human rights and support the principles contained in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. We endeavour to advance respect for fundamental human rights by leading by example in our business capacity, with our direct business partners, and in the communities, we operate.

We encourage positive contribution of employees which can make economic and social progress and the realization of decent work for all; and minimize and resolve the difficulties which may rise during various business operations.

At IAG, we strive to raise awareness of human rights among employees through regular human rights educational activities. In addition, human rights enlightenment is promoted through human rights education for newly appointed managers and new employees. We identify negative impact on human rights and work to prevent or mitigate such impact.

We remain committed to fostering a culture of inclusion, and diversity remains one of our top priorities. The success of our company depends on our highly skilled and qualified workforce. Having the right people with the right skills is essential for our company growth.

Commitment to people is one of our core values. We are committed to provide opportunities for our employees to develop, achieve professional aspiration, and enjoy successful and rewarding career within the company.

IAG Supports the efforts to prevent and works to eliminate forced labour. We are aware of the responsibilities resulting from our impact and fully accept the accountability to ensure respect for human rights in our activities worldwide.

IAG ensures the rewards of globalization are evenly distributed. We live in a global economy that is characterized by an unprecedented rise in global trade, global investment, global distribution of production, and global (multinational) corporations. Globalization affects workers and labor standards. Workers in every sector are affected by globalization and international competition. For example, trade in services is growing even faster than trade in goods. United Nations organizations have documented declining incomes, increasing income disparities, increasing poverty, and rising unemployment in many nations.

We aim to enrich and continuously improve our positive health culture where our employees can work to their full potential, both in mind and body.

The goal of IAG's ethics management is to conduct business in a transparent manner based on fairness, honestly and faithfulness and to constantly evolve into a top-tier company. In so doing,

fulfilling its responsibility to customers, suppliers, stakeholders and society at large, we build trust in our company and our products which helps us to expand into various markets and improve our corporate value and reputation.

IAG respects all labour laws and regulations as governed by the United Nations and government laws of each respective country where IAG operates. Phases of particular focus to IAG are opposing forced labour and child labour, providing equal opportunities for employment with regard to gender, ethnicity and race, working conditions and fair pay.

We are committed to ensuring that our employees are consulted about any changes to the business that might have an impact on their employment. Addressing every aspect of labour abuses help increase awareness among employees regarding possible occurrence of such mistreatments and thus proves to be an effective preventive measure within IAG's business operations.

IAG's established framework of sustainable development policies make an important contribution to the promotion of economic and social welfare; to the improvement of living standards and the satisfaction of basic needs; to the creation of employment opportunities, both directly and indirectly; and to the enjoyment of human rights, including freedom of association, throughout the world.

Leading policy for IAG is to guarantee equal opportunity without abusing human rights for all its employees. Therefore, IAG is constantly implementing policies beyond minimum legal requirements regarding: supporting the freedom of association, elimination of forced labour and child labour, elimination of all forms of discrimination.

IAG's employees have the right to work in an environment in which respect for people's dignity is at the core of our organisation. The company and all its employees have accountability to ensure a working environment in which everyone is treated with respect and dignity.

Further, IAG abides by International Labour Organization's (ILO's) eight fundamental conventions in support of UN Global Compact's four labor principles, including:

- Freedom of Association and Protection of the Right to Organise Convention, 1948 (No. 87)
- Right to Organise and Collective Bargaining Convention, 1949 (No. 98)
- Forced Labour Convention, 1930 (No. 29)
- Abolition of Forced Labour Convention, 1957 (No. 105)
- Minimum Age Convention, 1973 (No. 138)
- Worst Forms of Child Labour Convention, 1999 (No. 182)
- Equal Remuneration Convention, 1951 (No. 100)
- Discrimination (Employment and Occupation) Convention, 1958 (No. 111)

Being a multinational corporation, IAG respects and obeys the national laws of the countries we operate in and international regulations. We give due consideration to local practices and respect relevant international standards equally. IAG honors the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948) and the corresponding International Covenants (1966) adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations as well as the Constitution of the International Labour Organization and its principles according to which freedom of expression and association are essential to sustained progress.

As a socially responsible employer IAG continuously provides all employees with a safe working environment. All obligatory training and drills are carried out according to the company's training plan. Safety instructions are made accessible to all employees. Each and every employee on a particular position is equipped with work clothes, gear and equipment suitable for their responsibilities.

Based on employees' feedback, IAG has launched a number of initiatives spanning from employee recognition, internal events and communication, new career management and development program, flexible working hours and etc. Many social events were held across our areas of operations, all of these foster unity and sense of belonging.

Just an example of IAG's contribution to social local events are our commitment as a main sponsor of a basketball team who has been playing in the 1st League of the local tournament in a country where IAG operates. In 2019 IAG became main contributor for the building of a library in a university named after IAG's President and CEO.

In another country, IAG sponsored the local football club where a lot of our employees are members. This is a way to encourage more of our employees to participate in sport activities.

In 2022, IAG undertook responsibility of preparing and maintaining a Cricket field for the employees. In this field, we have provided all modern high-quality facilities such as LED lighting system all around the field, regular pitch and grass maintenance in order to organize cricket tournaments for our employees and create leisure and fitness activities for their after-office hours.

Our practice and sustainability policies are designed to guarantee that all employees reflect in their daily work the high ethical standards set by the company.

IAG is upholding the freedom of association by means of providing the right to form and join workers' organizations of their choice. Workers are allowed to freely choose representatives and no management interference is obstructing their privilege in collective bargaining. Moreover, IAG is working on implementation of rigid sets of rules preventing from any form of harassment levied on unions' representatives at the work place.

Providing access to all workplaces in the company and allowing attendance to certain management meetings in order to initiate genuine dialog with workers' representatives through consultations are just few of the strategies which reflect company's desire to abide to the labour principles regarding the freedom of association and the right to collective bargaining.

IAG respects the right of freedom of association and collective bargaining for all its employees. Representative of employees are neither favoured nor discriminated.

We strongly believe that it is IAG's corporate responsibility to avoid causing or contributing to adverse impacts through business activities, and seek to prevent or mitigate adverse human rights impacts that are indirectly linked to our operations, products or services, even if we have not contributed to those impacts.

IAG strictly does not engage in any practices related to forced labor. IAG takes immediate and effective measures within their own competence to secure the prohibition and elimination of forced labour in their operations. We require all recruitment to be consistent with the human rights policy, equal opportunity requirements, relevant employee protection legislation and appropriate pre-employment screening in order to prevent from involving the company into activities harming vulnerable workers. One of the means for prevention is initiating regularly consultations with

employees and workers' representatives as well as other groups concerned. Further, IAG plans to include in our sets of sustainability development policies a transparent procedure for appointed employee to educate and inform the workers in order to prevent their becoming involved in forced or compulsory labour practices as well as to prevent vulnerable workers from possible abusive and fraudulent practices during recruitment and placement process.

IAG guiding philosophy is intended to abide to effectively abolish child labour. We require from all our employees to conform with the relevant protection legislation and to strictly observe labour requirements such as: minimum age for working in the particular country, minimum weekly hours of work that can be undertaken legally by children below this age, minimum age for hazardous work, other legal requirements if any regarding child labour. Anti-corruption Principles

International Armored Group manages its entire global supply chain. At IAG, we always conduct business with integrity, transparency, utmost accountability and in full compliance with the anti-corruption laws of the countries in which we operate.

We pride ourselves with our consistent efforts to enhance management systems and adopt good practices to ensure the best possible results over the long term. It is important that our employees understand that anti-corruption is part of our mindset.

Anti-bribery and corruption compliance — and the mitigation of associated risk — continue to be some of the main challenges that companies are facing, both in their domestic markets and abroad.

At IAG, we take a zero-tolerance stance to corruption, money laundering and violations of fair competition, data privacy, export control and human rights principles, as well as other breaches of applicable laws. A key element of integrity is compliance and adherence to the law and to our own internal regulations.

To be effective, the IAG compliance system must continuously adapt to meet business-specific risks and multiple local legal requirements. The aim of compliance risk management is to detect compliance risks at an early stage and derive measures to prevent or mitigate risks. In such a way, compliance can make an important contribution to the achievement of corporate goals.

A precautionary management approach is taken in reviewing our entire work process to identify any potential risks. Once recognized, such risks are constantly reviewed and improvement measures are taken through robust follow-up management.

IAG makes a clear stand against corruption, and its internal procedures support its anti-corruption commitment. We believe that our way of doing business demonstrates our values. We always strive for sound competition and work for the benefit of our customers without promoting illegitimate interests.

IAG does not accept any kind of corrupt activities, extortion or bribery and thus takes on a rigorous approach towards accepting any benefits. Our integrity is non-negotiable – we do not tolerate corruption or bribery of any kind. All our employees must adhere to the highest ethical standards of conduct in all of our business activities and must act in a manner that enhances IAG's reputation. We want our employees to know that they can provide information on any concern they have, understanding where they can report, know what happens after they make such a report, and ensure they feel safe in providing a report.

In procuring products, materials and equipment, IAG has formulated a Procurement Policy and Guidelines with the aim of fulfilling social responsibility in the entire supply chain. We share our policies and guidelines with suppliers and expect them to adhere and implement them within their companies.

This responsibility extends beyond the unequivocal role of senior management, all managers must embody to our commitment to ensure that all business decisions and actions in their areas of responsibility are always in accordance with the relevant requirements and our values and guidelines.

It is our main policy to conduct all of our business in an honest and ethical manner. We take a zero-tolerance approach to bribery and corruption and are committed to acting professionally, fairly and with integrity in all our business dealings and relationships wherever we operate and implementing and enforcing effective systems to counter bribery.

We have a great focus on carrying our risk assessment and know-your-customer procedure on every current and potential client which allows us to catch suspicious circumstances relating to compliance violations.

We prohibit bribery and corruption in all forms. We do not offer, promise, give, demand or accept any bribe or other undue advantage, whether directly or indirectly to obtain, retain or direct business or to secure any other improper advantage in the conduct of business. Nor do we allow gifts, entertainment and per diem reimbursements to be given or received as a reward or encouragement for preferential treatment.

To promote the voluntary elimination of any unethical practices that may occur among IAG employees or in relation to stakeholders (customers, suppliers, stakeholders and etc.) and to establish transparent and sound organizational culture, we operate the self-reporting program to regularly report on unjustified business practices according to the predefines reporting form.

This policy should not be used for complains relating to personal work-related grievances, such as an interpersonal conflict between the informant and another person, concerns regarding discrimination, sexual harassment, harassment, breaches of policy, the creation or existence of unsafe work conditions.

Our policy against bribery states that all employees must act with good judgement and take responsibilities if offered a gift or benefit. It is a matter of course for our employees to comply with current regulations and legislation. Every successfully executed project shall furthermore annually go through an assessment regarding risk of bribery.

Assessment, Policy and Goals

IAG is among the world's most recognizable armored vehicle manufacturers and our continued success depends in large part upon the trust and confidence of the thousands of clients across the globe. It is of great importance that our business partners and customers can rely on us.

Purpose and goals of the policy:

IAG's anti-bribery policy is intended to outline the company's risks related to bribery and corruption, to highlight our responsibilities under both the relevant anti-corruption laws and company policies, and to provide us with the tools and support necessary to identify and combat those anti-corruption risks.

Risks and/or consequences of non-compliance:

A violation of relevant anti-corruption laws can lead to severe civil and criminal penalties and reputational harm to our company. IAG's employees that violate these laws can also face severe civil and criminal penalties, including but not limited to, disciplinary action, termination of employment, and jail time.

Scope and Range of application:

IAG expects all employees, officers, directors, and third parties working on its behalf to refrain from engaging in any form of bribery or corruption, irrespective of citizenship, domicile, or location.

Our Policies on bribery and corruption apply to all IAG employees at all levels, directors, officers, agency workers, seconded workers, volunteers, interns, agents, contractors, external consultants, third-party representatives and business partners.

Our policy and training make clear that we will offer full support to employees who encounter difficult situation as a result of their refusal to pay bribes. At the same time, it also states that the company will take disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal, against employees who fail to comply.

IAG actively works against corruption at all levels of business, including extortion and bribery.

To prepare and disclose trustworthy financial statements, IAG ensure that its internal accounting control system is effectively designed and operate in order to prevent and identify any errors or fraudulent practices that may cause distortion on such statements.

IAG's Code of Ethical Business Conduct highlights the company's policies against corruption. It comes to show that IAG recognises its obligations towards the prevention of bribery and corruption and the need to avoid any business that might lead to involvement in, or encourage, corruption or breach of any law relevant to countering bribery and corruption. All Personnel must strictly comply with this policy, which is designed to ensure to the greatest extent possible full compliance with the local penal laws, as well as any other anti-corruption law which may apply locally where IAG operates.

Below is excerpt from IAG's Code of Ethical Business Conduct:

Legal Compliance

The industry which IAG operates in is heavily regulated by governing bodies at various levels, and it is imperative that we meet all the requirements set forth by these organizations. In addition, we will grant full cooperation during all government inspections and inquiries. It is strictly prohibited to impede an inspection, including but not limited to lying to inspectors, destroying or altering information and unreasonable delaying the release of information.

Bribes/Kickbacks

Bribery or kickback is the exchange of valuable goods (i.e. money, gifts, or favors) for preferential treatment. Offering and receiving bribes or kickbacks directly or indirectly is illegal and strictly forbidden. Violation of this policy may result in penalties and/or termination in addition to possible criminal charges.

Gifts, Meals, and Entertainment

IAG competes solely on the merits of the products and services. It is our policy not to influence the purchasing decision of potential customers through the usage of gifts, meals and entertainment. This is regulated by various government organizations, and it is crucial for all IAG employees to ensure that these regulations are not violated. Gifts, meals and entertainment are considered non-material and acceptable only up to an amount of US\$100.

Donations

IAG prohibits providing a donation to improperly influence a government official, or in exchange for any improper favor or benefit. It may, however, be permissible to make donations directly to a government agency (rather than to an individual government official) as part of a charitable effort.

Clientele

IAG will only conduct business with legitimate and recognized governments, international organizations, non-governmental organizations and lawful private companies. We refuse to conduct business with countries who are under UN / NATO Embargo list and any clients who are engaged in unlawful activities.

International Business

The geographic scope of IAG spans across many countries across the world, and it is imperative that we comply with all the laws of the regions in which we are conducting business as well as any additional regulations from international governing bodies. Furthermore, we may encounter foreign traditions, cultures, norms, and mannerisms, and it is important for us to be aware and respect these issues when engaging in business activities overseas in order to maintain our professional reputation.

Internal ethics and integrity committee is engaged in measuring outcomes and is responsible for reporting to the IAG board on all issues and reports regarding ethics and integrity.

All purchasing activities are executed within the boundaries of our principles. These are the guiding principles of our supply chain management and form an integral part of all relevant supplier management process. Those include supplier selection and supplier qualification and evaluation. Responsible supply chain management can contribute the progress of a company.

IAG achieves its obligations through:

- Whistleblowers and their reports strictly remain confidential, and the whistleblowing system is operated in a highly secure manner.
- If a whistleblower reports corruptive practices involving himself/herself, this is taken into consideration in the reasonable resolution of the concerned case.
- Information on whistleblowers and stakeholders is kept strictly confidential, and fair investigations are conducted on their reports to ensure the reasonable resolution of the concerned case.
- Recognising that it operates in territories that have underdeveloped fiscal regimens and where bribery and corruption are known to be present as a commercial risk.
- Ensuring that the Company's management is alerted immediately of any potential compliance issues.
- Insisting that clients, business partners, suppliers, subcontractors, agents and other relevant third parties work to prevent bribery and corruption.
- Personnel may not engage in a personal relationship with a client, vendor or consultant to the Company, where the relationship may create the appearance of unethical conduct or of a conflict of interest.
- Third-parties acting for or on behalf of IAG are prohibited from making corrupt payments on our behalf.
- Promotion of supply chain diversity – we set supply chain diversity as our goal of responsible business and promote it globally.
- Regular internal audits.
- We pursue quality from customer's perspective.
- We engage in quality improvement with our business partners.
- We conduct periodic internal audits of relevant business operations to help ensure the IAG's continued compliance with applicable Anti-Bribery laws and Policy.

Implementation

1. We comply with all applicable domestic and international laws and regulations, appropriate standards and principles, including all competition, anti-trust and anti-money laundering laws.

2. We strictly take responsibility for and deal with misconduct.
3. Prices and quantity discounts for all products, including but not limited to, armored vehicles, spare parts and maintenance services, are published for all sales staff to use.
4. All transactions and contracts are internally reviewed before being sent to the client to ensure prices accurately reflect company's price list. If discrepancies are found, the overseeing manager will review the contract to ensure corruption practices are not found.
5. Financial statements are independently audited every year.
6. Each new employee is presented with our anti-corruption and bribery policy handbook.
7. Training Personnel employed by the Company to recognise, avoid and report bribery and corruption.
8. Setting up procedures and processes designed to minimize the chance that bribery and corruption may occur.
9. Conducting internal and external checks and audits, as necessary, to detect and deter any act of bribery and corruption.
10. Any violation against our policies or our code of conduct shall be reported to our HR manager and/or our safety representative.
11. Any red flags raised during a due diligence review of a vendor are addressed to the satisfaction of our legal counsel prior to entering into a relationship with a new third party.
12. We contribute to promoting the interest of stakeholders, from customers to local communities, through compliance management, and fulfil our responsibility and obligation towards the society.

Outcomes

1. IAG has never been investigated or accused of corruption practices in any part of the world.
2. IAG has never been blacklisted or expelled from any agency or company for any reason.
3. Internal audits by senior management have revealed no evidence of corruption in the history of the company.
4. No investigations, legal cases or fines have been made against IAG.

Objectives

1. IAG to look for Anti-Bribery training options to help employees identify corruption in the work environment.
2. Risks related to anti-corruption will be added to the annual risk assessment of the company.
3. IAG to implement strict policies for monitoring to fight corruption and bribery within its business operations.
4. IAG to maintain flawless track record on corruptions cases.
5. IAG to report any corruption cases detected within suppliers, subcontractors or clients operations.
6. IAG to work on our new anti-corruption training package.
7. IAG to develop continuous monitoring concept for export control risks
8. IAG to develop business dialogue approach for the early identification and mitigation of specific risks.
9. IAG to monitor its management system and ethical initiatives.
10. Any red flags raised during a due diligence review of a vendor must be addressed to the satisfaction of the company legal counsel prior to entering the relationship with the third party, and any remediation measure put in place should be documented in the due diligence tool.

IAG is always cautious when signing agreements with clients, suppliers and customers to ensure that the scope of the assignments is clearly stated and that potential risks and uncertainties are thoroughly

eliminated.

We are absolutely committed to minimizing negative impact on people and society and in promoting culture with zero tolerance for corruption.

IAG's management bears the liability for the maintenance and efficiency of the corporate system of Anti-Corruption Compliance as a whole, and also for ensuring the implementation and execution of controls and procedures of the Anti-Corruption Compliance system in the areas of its functional competence. Our Employees, irrespective of the position they hold, are personally liable for observance of the principles and requirements of this Policy and the Applicable Anti-Corruption Laws, as well as for the actions (inactions) of the persons subordinate to them who violate these principles and requirements

It is the policy of IAG to exclude from its products, parts and supply chain those materials and equipment with a high risk of contributing to conflict or being associated with forced labor or human rights violations.

Conclusion

Corporate sustainability starts with a company's value system and a principles-based approach to doing business. By incorporating the Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact into strategies, policies and procedures, and establishing a culture of integrity, companies are not only upholding their basic responsibilities to people and the planet but also setting the stage for long-term success.

As a signatory to the United Nations Global Compact, IAG supports the 10 principles of the Global Compact in the areas of human rights, labour, environment, anti-corruption. We aim to achieve our purpose by advancing corporate activities based on environmental- friendly approach which will provide a new basis for the actions of each person within the company.

IAG is committed to maintaining a world-class compliance culture in every IAG business and everywhere we operate around the globe. We recognize that our reputation for integrity and compliance is a competitive advantage. IAG's commitment to performing with integrity is instilled in every employee as a nonnegotiable expectation of behavior. We embrace, support, and enact a set of core principles in the areas of human rights, labour, the environment, and anti-corruption.

Placing our customers at the core is a tradition and obligation within IAG. The way we do it however must adapt to a world where change itself is constant. To meet these challenges, IAG strives to become more flexible. In 2022 we will aim to define a strong sales vision and key messages; use cutting-edge sales methods to streamline and optimize the sales tools and processes.

We linked our corporate goals to the UN Global Compact principles because we believe that IAG can help achieve progress on critical sustainability challenges in cooperation with our stakeholders.
