As only very few universities in Lebanon offer such an opportunity, the PU Start Up Incubator will ensure that participants are provided with the appropriate guidance and the professional expertise.

3. Women Empowerment Club

In reflection of its core values and commitment to "Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion" (JEDI) and informed by its strong belief that societies and economies cannot develop and advance without empowered women, PU has decided to establish the "Women Empowerment Club", standing by women in their fight for equity, equality, justice, and inclusion. The main objectives of the "Women Empowerment Club" are to support initiatives, topics, events, and programs around key topics in the area of women's rights; promote an inclusive and safe environment for Lebanese women; and lead by example to combat stereotypes, attitudes, and behaviors that would hinder Lebanese women empowerment. A few topics in this area may spark debates and controversy that do not have unanimous approval; nonetheless, our role as a University is to grant and foster a safe environment for constructive conversations that are focused on the advancement of society as a whole. While the club's core mission is to primarily empower women, everyone, men and women, should equally bear the responsibility of enabling such social and cultural advancement.

4. Water Quality Testing

Lebanon is currently dealing with a major crisis, which is water contamination, especially after the Cholera outbreak. The water-quality testing service at PU is intended to be an effective method for tackling water contamination challenges. The service is performed by PU's Civil and Environmental Department in collaboration with PU's Laboratories Department to examine the bacteriological parameters of water such as Cholera, Fecal Coliform and Total Coliform. The main objective of the service is to assist the private sector in applying the evidence achieved from the testing, to improve the sector's well-being. Additionally, it helps initiate efficient responses to water quality contaminants.

5. Accessible and Inclusive Education: Differently-Abled Students

PU firmly believes that no student should be excluded from participation, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in any university program or activity. In line

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with such belief, the university is committed to ensuring that differently-abled students have equal access to the offered educational opportunities, experiences, and activities. PU campus is equipped with all the needed facilities for a comprehensive access such as wheelchair access ramps and specially-customized tables in the classrooms.

6. Peer Support Program

PU has initiated the peer support program (PSP) in order to create a collaborative and student-centered learning and teaching environment. The program is run by student mentors who dedicate few hours per week to help their peers, mentees, in a range of subjects, including freshman mathematics, calculus, chemistry, physics, and English listening and speaking capabilities across intensive levels. The aim of the program goes beyond focusing on content to develop a range of generic skills for both mentors and mentees and boost their self-confidence.

7. Clubs and Societies

PU students are able to join a wide variety of clubs and societies based on their interests. Such clubs and societies support students with their community building skills and in cultivating campus life. Clubs and societies are administered by students with the help of a faculty adviser.
