CEO STATEMENT

As a signatory of the United Nations Global Compact, the Austrian Natural Resources and International Cooperation Agency (Oesterreichische Agentur für Waldentwicklung, Waldbewirtschaftung und internationale Kooperation, hereafter abbreviated to ANRICA) is committed without reservation to compliance with the ten principles of the UN Initiative.

ANRICA was founded back in 2009 by governmental and semi-governmental agencies as well as by private enterprises to join forces in international cooperation on climate change, rural development and natural resources management and is supported by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, Environment and Water Management.

The foundation of ANRICA is based on a modern national Forest Programme which was developed in an open stakeholder process back in 2005, after which a strong international commitment to sustainable development of rural areas and multifunctional forestry was demanded.

As rural communities are most vulnerable in relation to natural hazards and misguided management of natural resources, ANRICA was given the task of supporting governments in their efforts to manage the impact of climate change on rural areas by providing know-how and expertise, as well as some basic funding.

ANRICA's objective is to support governments by providing governance, technical support and capacity building services by joining the forces of its associates. All associates of ANRICA have established a company-wide code of conduct and therefore all services provided throughout ANRICA are in compliance with the company codes of conducts as well.

Furthermore ANRICA is operating under the supervision of the Austrian Federal Ministry of Sustainability and Tourism and reports frequently to the Ministry.

DESCRIPTION OF ANRICA PRINCIPLES

The ANRICA engagement is driven by the main principle of free, prior and informed consent (FPIC) when working in rural development and natural resource management.
