WLB has taken the following actions in support of the Global Compact.

Led the development of a Beneficial Loans Toolkit for employers (Principles 1 and 6)

As employers grapple with how best to help staff in the midst of a cost of living crisis, West London Business released a Beneficial Loans Toolkit, giving employers much-needed practical guidance on how to issue small loans to employees as a manageable and safer alternative to high-interest payday lending.

Better Futures+ (Principles 7, 8 and 9)

WLB is commissioned by the Mayor of London (under Green New Deal funding) to deliver a comprehensive business support programme to help SMEs across the capital plan their transition to net zero by 2030.

Outputs:

- 456 eligible companies have registered for Better Futures+ over the past 18 months (70% of target our target by end March 2023) ...290 of these companies particularly engaged ...and of these 125 have completed their carbon footprints on Climate Essentials
- 50 webinars and workshops
- 86,200 minutes of webinars viewed live or on demand through YouTube; the most watched webinar had 106 viewers
- 200 hours of bespoke 1:1 support with industry specialists
- Over 50 partner organisations engaged across the capital from local authorities to Business Improvement Districts

Partnership working

In 2021 we were recognised as a UNFCC observer organisation. This allowed us to coordinate a delegation of leaders to COP26 in Glasgow. This is something we intend to repeat in 2023.

In 2022 we partnered with Anthropy (https://anthropy.uk/) a new UK-focused "social Davos" that took place at the Eden Project Cornwall. We curated two panels and were delighted that Steve Kenzie (Executive Director, UN Global Compact UK) was able to participate in one of these.

WLB staff attend UN Global Compact UK webinars occasionally as a CPD activity.

Part III. Measurement of Outcomes

Cost of living crisis

We saw a creative response to the Beneficial Loans Toolkit from Corporate partners looking at a variety of ways to use the mechanism that we hadn't previously considered – loans being used by staff to fund everything from training to solar panels.

We also introduced the loans mechanism as a benefit available to WLB staff.

Many Better Futures companies have progressed onto the Undaunted accelerator; WLB's Chief Executive is a Member of its advisory board, making WLB one cog in the network that has delivered:
