3.1. Supporting the Kenya's floriculture sector to be more sustainable.

Ufadhili Trust, has continued to work with stakeholders within the floriculture sector in Kenya with a view to enhancing its sustainability. During the reporting period, Ufadhili Trust has worked with flower companies, civil society/NGO partners, the industry's lead organization; the Kenya Flower Council (KFC) and other stakeholders to address the sustainability/social performance challenges facing the industry.

From 2021, up to date, Ufadhili Trust has worked with the <u>Kenya Flower Council (KFC)</u>, <u>Women Win</u> and other Civil Society/Women Rights Organizations, to promote women's economic empowerment and resilience within the sector. This engagement involves working with flower companies in Kenya to address the sustainability challenges they face.

Further, Ufadhili Trust worked with <u>True Price/Impact Institute</u> to undertake social impact assessments in flower compabies in Kenya aimed at addressing the sustainability gaps that exist. Ufadhili Trust has also supported a number of flower farms in creating awareness amongst its workers on the prevention of Gender Based Violence (GVB)/harassment within their establishments.

3.2. Documentation of the resilience stories by Kenyan horticultural companies, and support to its workers during the Covid-19 pandemic period.

Ufadhili Trust in partnership with Hivos, through its *Women@Work Campaign*, documented the resilience stories from Kenyan horticultural companies, on what they were doing to remain resilient/sustainable during the Covid-19 pandemic period. The goal was to motivate other businesses to find innovative and sustainable solutions in tackling the negative effects of the pandemic.

Further, Ufadhili Trust and the *Women@Work Campaign* partners, supported thousands of workers within the sector with food packages/mobile money transfers as a relief measure due to disruption of incomes/livelihoods as a result of the pandemic.
