BRIEFS ABOUT KASESE HUMANIST SCHOOL IN 2022

School reopened on 12th January 2022

School enrollment has grown gradually:

Kasese Humanist primary section has an enrollment of 296 pupils.

Kasese Humanist Bizoha campus has closed the year with an enrollment of 312 pupils

Kasese Humanist Kahendero campus has closed with a total of 210 pupils

Our secondary section (Municipal High Humanist School) closed the year with a total of 86 students.

Our school project is now a registered nonprofit company and is now running as a charity school

A total of 65 candidates sat for Primary Leaving Examination this year

There was massive adherence to Keeping the fight against covid19 pandemic, dished out face masks, soap, hand washing facilities.

There was renovation works on our school six stance latrine by a local organization called CaFOMi after our school having served as a refugee center for locally displaced people who were affected by the floods of river Nyamwamba.

I repainted some classrooms at the Rukoki school primary section.

We hosted a volunteer from the United States and was with us for two months

We managed to add some more furniture to the campuses of Rukoki, Muhokya and Kahendero. The furnitures were bought from school owners who were out of business due to covid19.

We strengthened our forests and added several fruit trees at our campuses, more eucalyptus, acacia trees, bamboo grasses and neem trees.

We secured a small grant from Go Humanity based in the United States, the grant is helping out in Food Security Project initiatives. Each month starting September they have been extending 100\$ towards our food security initiatives.

Humanist Victoria based in Australia extended some relief to teachers at all our campuses as tokens for their service and it was shared. They gave a one time support of 300\$US each year and have done it in the last two years.

We continue with vocational skills works in boosting carpentry, tailoring, welding, Auto mechanics at both primary, secondary section and at our Auto Garage. The project is supported by two Australian friends who strongly wish our students better in acquiring vocational skills while at our schools or after the students leave school.

Our secondary section with effect from January this year, our school name changed to MUNICIPAL HIGH SCHOOL KASESE.

Municipal High school Kasese, is a registered school, with Registration number and Exam sitting Center for Uganda National Examinations Board.

Our secondary section is in learning spaces of Kasese Humanist school and the school is a positive development able to absorb some of the students from the three primary schools we own in different places.

The secondary section too has similar challenges as the primary section and we are tackling one by one and are optimistic we shall solve them as time goes on.

The SECONDARY SCHOOL has a staff of 13 teachers, A school bursar and a School secretary

The PRIMARY SCHOOL SECTION at all the campuses has a staff of 37.

CHALLENGES AND REQUESTS OF THE SCHOOL:

- **Staff salaries payment** is still a big challenge as sometimes our parents disappoint by not all honoring to meet fees needs for their children.
- **Need to take upgrade our teachers** from Grade 3 to the required Grade 5 Diploma or Degree program. The government has made it mandatory for school teachers to be grade 5 or above, originally all our teachers are Grade 3.
- **High level of children needing support as tuition and basic welfare** as in needy, vulnerable orphans and disadvantaged homes face these hardships.
- There is a need to work on our primary school status of getting an examination sitting center number, this is very possible by putting in financial resources which is still limited at the moment.
- There is insufficient rainwater harvesting tanks to collect and store water that can be used for bathing, sanitation in toilets, latrines, washing clothes, utensils and using it for irrigation purposes. The Bizoha, Rukoki and Kahendero school has only one tank and I am looking at putting a stretch of tanks at the campuses.
- There is **in adequate laboratory instruments and reagents** to ensure we are well stocked in our laboratory especially for the secondary section.
- We need more adequate school furniture as a basement for the increasing number we anticipate next year.
- Our school tractor needs front tires, some ploughing plates and possible paint spray to give it a smart look.
- There is a need for more computers at the campuses for computer literacy skills and computer studies.
