COMMUNICATING ENGAGEMENT OF A-PAD Indonesia 2021-2022

Activities and Impacts Summary :

The Critical Interventions we made are :

- 1. Building intersectoral collaboration in disaster emergency response : 1.000+ beneficiaries in Bali and West Nusa Tenggara region for Tourism Resilience
- 2. Development of sustainable business continuity plans : 250+ organisation across sectors
- 3. Increased capacity of A-PAD Indonesia in emergency response : 1,000+ beneficiaries for disaster in Palu, Banten, Semeru (East Java) and East Lombok

The initiatives that A-PAD Indonesia carried out in this period are very much reflecting the UNGC Principles , SDGs as well as Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction for some specific goals of the following :

- Engage with Global Compact Local Networks : As member of VP Partnership Development and proactively led Humanitarian related activities, as resource person for IGCN Open House session for new prospective members
- Engage companies in Global Compact to promote resilience building towards disasters including climate change related issues
- Join and/or support special initiatives on women empowerment , human rights, anticorruption and environment / climate related activities
- Attend other local network activities

Up to 2022, A-PAD Indonesia has brought impacts as follows : 97+ partners nationwide, 50+ regional activities conducted, 100+ trainings conducted in disaster response, safety certification and community-based risk reduction. Apart from support of Ministry of Foreign Affairs Japan, we have mobilized 1.8 Million USD and in overall reaching 65,000+ people as beneficiaries.
