

# **About the Alliance**

"The Asia Pacific Alliance for Disaster Management (A-PAD) is a transnational disaster aid alliance that works to facilitate cooperation and understanding between governments, private companies, and NGOs in the Asia Pacific region. A - PAD Network currently exists in Japan, Korea, Philippines, Indonesia, Srilanka, Bangladesh, and Nepal.

"Countries of the Asia-Pacific region experience many severe natural disasters. In order to prevent, address and minimize damage from such disasters, the establishment of comprehensive system cooperation and support drawing on the private sector, NGOs, local communities, central government, and local authorities is urgently required.

Against this backdrop, six disaster aid national platforms from countries in the Asia-Pacific region have determined to launch a trans-national disaster aid alliance for the purpose of facilitating collaboration among countries in the Asia-Pacific region with the aim of delivering effective and efficient disaster assistance through disaster preparedness, risk reduction, relief, and recovery, hosted by the Japanese NGO for disaster management, Civic Force.

The establishment of the Alliance was announced at the 5th Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in October 2012 in Yogyakarta, Indonesia.

A-PAD presence in Indonesia started in 2012 coincide with Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (AMCDRR) in Yogyakarta. In Indonesia it was initially led by National Disaster Risk Reduction Platform (Planas PRB) as a forum for various stakeholders focusing Disaster Risk Reduction. A-PAD Indonesia became a legal entity in the country in 2017 to strengthen wider multi stakeholder engagement especially collaboration with the private sector to perform humanitarian activities in disaster management (relief, response, and recovery).




