Aims and purposes of the organization.

THE GREEN PROJECT OF EDASI —Sensitize stakeholders about climate change and stimulate 30 local youth and 100 farmers to embark on a reforestation programme using Indian Bamboo, rattan Aloe Vera. (Aloe vera) Chrysanthemum. (Chrysantheium morifolium) in Lafia, Niger State, Nigeria.
