Actions in support of the Principles

1.0 Human Rights

1.1 Homelessness is a Human Rights issue

Backpack Bed for Homeless works to improve the Human Rights of people who are homeless and do not have shelter.

This includes being actively involved with lobbying to groups such as the Australian Government, politicians, government departments, corporates and other community groups on the lack of basic human rights for these people. Numerous corporates internationally support our work.

If our society cannot adequately house homeless - then a minimum level of dignified emergency bedding should be provided.

Providing inadequate bedding impacts on the human rights of street sleeping homeless:

- The right to health and wellbeing
- The right to personal safety
- The right to privacy
- The right to non-discrimination
- · The right to freedom from cruel inhuman or degrading treatment

Our organisation was awarded an Australian Human Rights Award by the Australian Human Rights Commission in 2011 for our work.

1.2 Backpack Bed

The *Backpack Bed* is a dignified emergency bed provided for free to street sleeping homeless people without shelter as well as being an engagement tool to connect them with local homeless services.

Backpack Bed features

- Meets 47 international standards for quality and safety (independent lab testing)
- Awarded 7 international product design awards
- Fabric is waterproof, windproof, mildew resistant PLUS Fire retardant (meets 2 international standards)
- Mosquito mesh ventilation (head + chest + feet)
- Built-in 190cm insulated comfort mattress (ALSO fire retardant and anti-mildew)
- Tape sealed main seams
- Full body zipped sleeping area
- · Backpack with padded adjustable straps
- 3 x built-in storage pockets
- Lockable internal pocket (with supplied key lock)
- 2 x caribiner clips (clip on extra bags / belongings)
- Ultra lightweight street tough materials weighs ONLY 3kg / 6.6lb



1.2 Fire Retardant Sleeping Bag / Hypothermia Pack

Due to seeing first hand the undignified and unsuitable bedding provided to people without shelter, Backpack Bed for Homeless has also developed a Fire Retardant Sleeping Bag.

2.0 Labour

Our organisation is committed to the Labour principals. This includes using factories with accreditation for worker conditions such as BCSI.

3.0 Environment

Our organisation is committed to the Environment principals. This includes the materials selection for the *Backpack Bed*.

We independently lab test to meet several international chemical safety standards.

4.0 Anti-Corruption

Our organisation is committed to the Anti-Corruption principals. This means doing business responsibly and ethically.

5.0 Our Current Reach


The *Backpack Bed* is distributed to street sleeping homeless people without shelter across 8 countries.

5.1 Australia

Backpack Bed for Homeless has been a nationally registered Australian charity since 2007.

The Problem

- 45,800 Australian men, women and children will sleep outside this year.¹
- In 2021 2022 over 81,000 requests for accomodation across Australia could not be met.²
- Life expectancy for a homeless man sleeping on Aussie streets drops to 47 years.³
- Up to 21% of street sleeping homeless in Australia have suffered from cold weather injuries **hypothermia**, frostbite and trench foot.⁴
- 20% of NSW + 12% of VIC prisoners were sleeping on the streets before going to prison some homeless commit **desperation crime to get shelter**.⁵

Our Current Reach

- *Backpack Beds* are study proven to improve homeless peoples dignity, health, sleep, comfort, self-esteem and safety.
- The Social Return on Investment (SROI) of our program has been measured as \$3,319 / *Backpack Bed* in the areas of health, mental health & justice.⁶
- Over 36,000 Backpack Beds and 16,000 Fire Retardant Sleeping Bags have been distributed - which equates to over \$125m SROI and over 5m nights of dignified sleep for homeless without shelter.⁷

5.2 USA

Backpack Bed for Homeless was registered as a US charity 2014 with 501(c)3 status achieved in 2017.

The Problem

- TONIGHT 233,833 Americans will sleep on the streets, under bridges and "other places not intended for human habitation". 40.1% of the total homeless population of 582,462 people.⁸
- Since 2017, homelessness has increased by 6% across the USA.9

Our Current Reach


- 42 partner homeless agencies and growing.
- Over 1,500 Backpack Beds distributed.

5.3 Internationally

Our Current Reach Backpack Beds have also been distributed to homeless people without shelter in the United Kingdom, New Zealand, South Africa, Germany, Canada and Spain.

This was in partnership with local homeless agencies in those countries for distribution and funding. Where funding permits we will continue this important work.

6.0 Awards and Recognition

6.1 Human Rights

Our organisation was awarded an Australian Human Rights Award by the Australian Human Rights Commission in 2011 for our work.

Tony & Lisa Clark (co-designers of the *Backpack Bed*) were also nominated for both the 2015 and 2016 Australian of the Year awards as well as awarded a Professor Ian Frazer Humanitarian Award by Lions medical research.
