

Youths Enterprise Development & Innovation Society (YEDIS) is a nonprofit and youth-focused organization that promotes entrepreneurship education, youth employment, and community development for inclusive and sustainable economic growth. YEDIS primarily operates in underserved communities where there is a lack of quality education and decent jobs due to poor awareness, inadequate educational facilities, and primitive agricultural sources of livelihood, chiefly among girls and young women.

YEDIS introduces the youths to the enterprise world, encouraging and inspiring them to pursue their entrepreneurial ambitions and develop the critical business skills employers desire.

YEDIS provides a range of services and events designed to help youth develop new ideas, find support to make them realistic, set up their enterprises, have exposure to various sources of finances, and provide them with insights into the world of work.

YEDIS advocates for the United Nations SDGs in poverty reduction, quality education, gender equality, decent work, and sustainable communities. As of August 2023, YEDIS has empowered more than 10,000 underserved young people with entrepreneurship education, including girls and young women in agribusiness and creative industries, through capacity building, business plan proposal writing, digital literacy skills, material donations, and other business support services.

'With many young women and men unable to secure formal employment opportunities, encouraging entrepreneurship is an ever more critical way of harnessing their enthusiasm, energy, and ambition to contribute to economic development (ILO).'

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Empowerment of Underserved Agribusiness Young Women and Girls

28 JANUARY 2022

Youths Enterprise Development and Innovation Society (YEDIS) held a workshop on Marketing for Agricultural Products and the Empowerment of thirty women and girls at Iba, a rural community in Osun State, Nigeria, on 28 January 2022.

The YEDIS donated 100 liters of ten buckets to the best ten female entrepreneurs "fufu" producers and twenty thousand naira (N20,000) to the other 20 participants. "Fufu" is a solid food made from cassava and eaten mainly by West Africans. Women and girls dominate the agricultural cassava processing sector in Nigeria's rural communities as their livelihood. In the Iba community, "fufu" production takes the most significant percentage of the businesses due to the vast land for cassava production.

In line with the YEDIS mission to develop entrepreneurial mindsets among the youths and based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals Agenda (SDG 2030), YEDIS focuses on poverty reduction, gender equality, education, and industrialization to promote social wellbeing and community development.

At the empowerment event, one of the challenges raised by the participant is the lack of equipment and materials to package the product for long-distance and exportation outside the country.























































TECHNOLOGICAL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING FOR YOUTH IN OSOGBO, NIGERIA. 30 JANUARY 2022

As part of its commitment to reducing poverty and developing youth technical skills, YEDIS, partnering with "Adams Computer World Communication," trained six young males in phone and computer repairs and presented certificates of participation on 30th January 2022, Osogbo, Osun State, Nigeria. YEDIS continuously strives to develop passionate, young, and talented individuals with the required potential for self-reliance and social development.

The primary purpose of the training is to enable them to use the knowledge, technology, and skill they have acquired through the training to be self-employed and contribute to the tech society and community development.

According to the YEDIS program coordinators, Mr. Ola Timothy emphasized adequate commitment to business and readiness to take risks. However, Mr. Ogunrinade Ranti implored the trained technician to continuously seek knowledge through mentoring and networking and abide by their professional code of ethics.

While delivering his lecture on "Application of Digital Technology to Technical skill," Mr. Rafiu Olaore, Director General, Youths Enterprise Development and Innovation Society, advised the trained technicians to acquire more formal education and continuously strive for knowledge and innovation in their profession. He underscores the Nigerian youth's need for technical competition with other global counterparts.

YEDIS program commenced in 2022, focusing on digital skill development for young people and female entrepreneurship program to reduce poverty, promote gender equality, encourage social wellbeing and community development.





EMPOWERMENT WORKSHOP FOR 200 FEMALE HAIR STYLISTS IN IKIRUN OSUN STATE, NIGERIA 11 JUNE 2022

Youths Enterprise Development and Innovation Society (YEDIS) organized the empowerment workshop and training for 200 female hairdressers in Ikirun, and its environment, Osun State, Nigeria, and with the distribution of twenty (20) hand dryers and 100 packs of hair rollers to young 'startups' participants on June 11th, 2022, at Kosamotu, Hall, Ikirun. TRANSFORMING LITERACY LEARNING SPACES DATE: 10TH SEPTEMBER 2022 VENUE: IKIRUN AND OSOGBO, OSUN STATE, NIGERIA

Participants: 78 Young people (age 17-40).

Period: 5 hours

Discussions:

1. Education is vital for human and community development. With education, the people have a sense of belongings and have the wherewithal to demand their rights from the government.

2. Young people in rural communities deserve better education for business innovation and good networking. Local initiatives and businesses can transform into national and international enterprises based on exposure and understanding. Improvement in local products facilitates human and economic development.

3. Education facilitates mutual understanding among the people to live a harmonious life.

4. Learning to know through education leads to learning to do. The possession of a higher degree certificate is not only for a paid job but to improve a person's talents, technologically and business-wise.

5. Application of education to a person's skill enhances outstanding achievement.

6. Education makes us knowledgeable and creative. We have broad knowledge through education, so it encourages curiosity and creativity.

7. Education promotes teamwork and team spirit. We learn to interact and live with people of different backgrounds.

8. Education teaches self-discipline. School teaching is different from home teaching. Therefore, morals and discipline are part of education. The fear of teachers and punishment for misbehaviour makes the students thoughtful and respectful. We learn to tolerate and respect the opinion of others.

9. Education promotes gender equality. In school, no discrimination among the students either in age or sex. Performance has no discrimination, so the girls lead in nearly every school activity. There is no sentiment in the class. Currently, females

have a higher percentage in the education and business sectors, making them have priority in society.

2-DAY WORSHOPS ON DIGITAL SKILLS AND ONLINE LEARNING BEST PRACTICES IN IKIRUN, NIGERIA.

9-10 NOVEMBER 2022

Youths Enterprise Development and Innovation Society (YEDIS), in partnership with the Federation of Ikirun Students Union (FIKSU) National Body, organised a 2-day workshop on Digital Skills and Online Learning Best Practices for Youth Education and Employment on the 9th and 10th of November 2022 at Akinorun Grammar School event hall in Ikirun, a marginalised community in Osun State, Nigeria.

YEDIS provided managerial and technical support, while FIKSU mobilised sixty student participants comprising youth between the ages of twelve and sixteen from six public secondary schools in Ikirun (ten students from each school). The beneficiaries constitute thirty-four girls and twenty-six boys.

The training includes the practical application of digital skills, web surfing practices, online learning methods and communication techniques, and social media networks for education and employment. Four volunteer digital experts facilitated the program that ran daily from 9 am to 1 pm.

The participants also learned the concept of digital marketing and information and communication technology for productive employment. We distributed the training manuals accordingly for the study and future references.

Finally, the organisers held quiz competitions to test the students' understanding of the training as part of the program. YEDIS presented a customised vest and cash gifts to the 1st and all the other best four winners and presented the certificate of completion to all sixty participants.

Youths Enterprise Development & Innovation Society (<u>YEDIS</u>) celebrated the International Day of Education on the 24th of January 2023 with 135 pupils between the ages of 2 and 14 in Ikirun, Nigeria. The event was held at Love of God Nursery and Primary School, Ikirun, Osun State, Nigeria, from 9 am to 12 pm.

<u>YEDIS</u> organized digital skills training and entrepreneurship and distributed educational materials (notebooks, pens, and pencils), including refreshments, to all participants. The program included cultural dancing, poetry, and career talks among the pupils.

The YEDIS Chief Executive Officer, Mr Rafiu Olaore, narrated the reasons for the International Day of Education as a directive by the United Nations to all SDGs stakeholders for the celebration on the 24th of January every year. 12 MAY 2023

Youth Enterprise Development & Innovation Society (YEDIS) is a nonprofit organization that promotes entrepreneurship education, youth employment, and underserved community development.

YEDIS, in collaboration with Olaseffy Variety Stores, organized a workshop on entrepreneurship, digital skills, and healthcare services to advance quality education and employment for young people between the ages of fourteen (14) and twenty (20), comprising (31) girls and (25) boys. The program was held on 12th May 2023 from 9.30 am to 12.30 pm at Wisdom Tutorial College, 196 Sabo Road, Osogbo, Osun State, Nigeria.

The speakers include Mrs Oluwakemi Oyeniyi from the health department, Obokun Local Government, Osun State Nigeria, Mr Ranti Ogunrinade, YEDIS program coordinator, and Mr Ola Timothy, YEDIS project coordinator.

Mr Ranti Ogunrinade delivered a lecture on entrepreneurship education and digital skills and their significance to quality education, decent employment and economic development. After his presentation, Mr Ogunrinade divided the participants into six groups and assigned each group to generate creative ideas, learn to work as a team and submit proposals for assessment.

Mr Ola Timothy emphasizes the fundamentals of digital marketing to advance youth employment. He reiterated that young people should use their social media technological skills for entrepreneurial purposes. According to Mr Ola Timothy, many applications on computers and Android phones are available to improve youth education and entrepreneurship skills, such as Excel, Microsoft Office, Adobe, grammar checkers, google my business, canvas, facebook and so on.

In her lecture, Mrs Oyeniyi admonished the youth to shun alcohol and illegal drugs and cultivate healthy lifestyles through cleanliness, healthy foods, regular exercise, engaging in intelligent work, and moderate rest. She stated that healthy entrepreneurs will always be productive.

YEDIS Executive Director Mr Rafiu Akinpelu Olaore enjoins the participants and youth to seek mentoring, teamwork, and social volunteering to develop their

entrepreneurial and leadership skills. Mr Olaore emphasized that the girls should use the workshop to evolve themselves as part of the YEDIS effort to promote quality education, gender equality, and decent jobs.

The owner of Wisdom Tutorial College, Mr Razak Alimi lauded the YEDIS Executive Director and the speakers for impactful presentations and fruitful workshops; he advised the participants to apply the skills productively.
















CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP AND EMPOWERMENT OF MARGINALIZED AGRIBUSINESS WOMEN AND GIRLS IN OBAAGUN, OSUN STATE, NIGERIA.

26 MAY 2023

Youths Enterprise Development and Innovation Society (YEDIS) is a nonprofit organization in Nigeria that promotes entrepreneurship education, youth employment and community development. YEDIS organized the capacity building workshop and empowerment of over 300 women and girls in palm oil and palm kernel seeds production on May 26th 2023, in Obaagun community, Osun State, Nigeria and Mrs Alaje Grace Oluwatosin delivered a speech on "Advancing Water Management in Agriculture to Promote Food Security and Youth Employment in Marginalized Communities."

Accordingly, YEDIS donated ten (10) iron drums and 200 plastics funnel and palm oil sievers to agrifood women practitioners in the Obaagun community, Osun State, Nigeria. Osun State is one of Nigeria's agricultural and agrifood business hubs, having significant numbers of farmers in rural areas. YEDIS chose the Obaagun community based on its large palm oil production, which women and girls specifically dominate.

YEDIS empowered the women and girls in the Obaagun community to support global food system transformation, advance agrifood production in marginalized communities, promote gender equality and youth employment, and economic development. Climate change and natural disasters affect farming in both underserved communities and globally. YEDIS aimed to encourage and network the young food farmers to pay attention to agrifood challenges and proactively manage any climate situation. The United Nations' interest in the agrifood transformation system is incredible; therefore, it emphasizes the promotion of agriculture in every community for food security.

YEDIS's effort to promote youth employment and community development is sacrosanct. Thus, YEDIS will continue to support the agrifood industry, young people's businesses, and the outgrowth of apprentices' services.

An adequate supply chain management system facilitates food production, decent employment, and economic development. Maintenance of an efficient agrifood supply chain, including crop plantation, harvesting, processing, transformation, packaging and storage, marketing, and distribution, adds value to food security and ensures viable employment opportunities. We encourage a feasible agriculture supply chain to promote exportation, decent jobs for youth, and community development.

Moreover, formal education is mandatory for girls and young women to advance their skills, better networking, and exposure to global business practices. To promote gender balance, women must have a voice in decision-making and leadership positions.

Girls' education goes beyond getting girls into school. It is also about ensuring that girls learn and feel safe while in school; have the opportunity to complete all levels of education, acquire the knowledge and skills to compete in the labour market; gain socio-emotional and life skills necessary to navigate and adapt to a changing world; make decisions about their own lives; and contribute to their communities and the world (World Bank).

Mr Rafiu Akinpelu Olaore, the Executive Director of YEDIS, appreciated all the YEDIS Team present, including Mr Ola Timothy, Mr Ranti Ogunrinade, Mr Taiwo Oladele, Miss Nafisat Bankole and Mrs Grace Oluwatosin Alaje and workshop beneficiaries for their cooperation and understanding. He asked the participants to apply the empowerment training skills and use the donated items efficiently for their palm oil and palm kernel seeds business. Rafiu Olaore stated they wanted to perform better, but funding limits YEDIS's effort to provide more materials to empower the youth and support the agrifood industries. Olaore opined that YEDIS would significantly impact more as soon as it raises funds.
