in international communities and every university over the world.

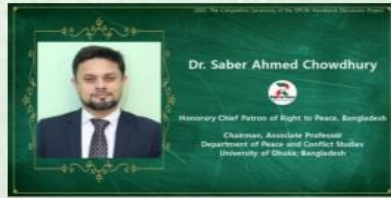
