on 10th November and an Art Exhibition "Colours of Life" on 11th November on the theme "ART FOR PEACE".

Prof. Zargar Zahoor, Rtd. Dean and Professor from Jamia Milia University, Delhi who has unchallengeable expertise in art was the resource, moderator, and chief guest of the event.
