This report aims to present the results of the activities carried out by the Soka Amazon Institute throughout the 2022 and reaffirm its purpose and mission.

Three decades ago, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda expressed his desire to establish in the Brazilian Amazon region a place of reference for spreading the humanist philosophy of respect for the dignity of life and the oneness of life and its environment.

In the Dr. Daisaku Ikeda Private Natural Heritage Reserve, located on the margins of the Encounter of the Waters, the Soka Amazon Institute has embodied the founder's contribution to the protection of the ecological integrity of the Amazon through environmental education, nature protection and support for scientific research.

This report summarizes the activities and outcomes obtained in 2022 and the framework of the Soka Amazon Institute. All actions were made possible with the support received from Soka Gakkai International, Brazil SGI and the contribution of ordinary citizens who tune in to the noble cause defended by the institute.






Laboratory and Headquarters Building



One of the main challenges in reforestation projects is to have access to high-quality and genetically diverse tree species seedlings.

To meet this need, the Soka Amazon Institute carries out expeditions to identify and collect seeds of Amazonian species to ensure that new reproductive matrices provide the required ecological balance.

With the seed processing initiative and the nursery of Amazonian species, we are able to expand the supply of forest species, with a greater range of matrices and high quality, for planting native species in reforestation and afforestation projects.

Annual Performance of Seedling Production

Fostering human values for the protection of the planet

The main program in the Socio-environmental Division is the Environmental Academy, in which students and educators from public and private schools in the city of Manaus are introduced to ecological knowledge and experience.

The program attends more than 2,000 students annually, keeping its activities even during the Covid-19 outbreak in an online basis. Students are inspired by the outdoor classes at the Dr. Daisaku Ikeda Private Natural Heritage Reserve.

The program is a partnership between the Institute and the Municipal Department of Education of Manaus. It is also sponsored by enterprises in the industrial district.

One of the features of the program and environmental education initiatives at RPPN Dr. Daisaku Ikeda is to inspire new generations of educators. This is the case of teacher Yomar Mendes Caster who, during his attendance at the Environmental Academy in October 2022, shared his joy of returning to RPPN Dr. Daisaku Ikeda after 20 years of his first visit to the Institute, when he was a student.

The Institute has strengthened its technical staff to develop its own research and studies, in order to develop knowledge and technologies for the Amazon.

Currently, the Institute hosts and supports research and studies in partnership with the major research and higher education institutions in the Amazon.

Through Technical Cooperation Agreements, the Institute enables the development of research within RPPN Dr. Daisaku Ikeda, in the fields of ecology, biology, environmental and forestry engineering, archeology and anthropology.

As a consequence of the established bonds of trust, the ideals and philosophy of the Institute's founder, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda, are spread in a way that causes deep reflection and inspires people and institutions in the region.

In recognition of the value and vision of Dr. Ikeda, the Federal University of Rondônia (UNIR), in July 2009, and the Federal Institute of Amazonas (IFAM), in November 2010, granted the title of *Doctor Honoris Causa* to the founder.

The Institute will continue to strengthen its role as an important point of connection between institutions, researchers, students and society, aiming first and foremost to foster human values, promote scientific research with a humanistic vision and contribute to the sustainable development of the Amazon.

Expansion of the production capacity of the seedling nursery reaching a storage of more than


20,000 seedlings that will be used in planting and donation actions in 2023 and 2024.




