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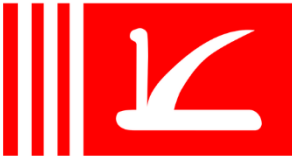

Day 3: Activity 2: Visiting Coffee curing plant Kashmiri Youths Learn About Coffee Processing in Coorg

As part of the Kashmiri Youth Exchange Programme, sponsored by the Government of India, around 120 youths from the valley visited a coffee curing plant in Coorg on December 28, 2023. The programme, organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Kodagu Youth Federation and Government of Karnataka, aims to expose the Kashmiri youths to the rich cultural and natural diversity of the country and foster national integration and peace.

The coffee curing plant, located at Kushalnagar in Coorg district, is one of the most sophisticated facilities for processing raw coffee in India. The

plant is owned by High Range Coffee Curing Private Limited, a company with over 50 years of experience in the coffee industry. The Kashmiri youths were given a guided tour of the plant and learned about the various stages of coffee processing, from sorting, grading, roasting, grinding, to packaging. They also got to sample different varieties of coffee, such as Arabica and Robusta, and appreciate the aroma and flavour of the brew.

The visit was appreciated by the principal of Coorg Public School and PU College, Dr. M. Ramachandran, who said that the programme was a great opportunity for the Kashmiri youths to learn about the coffee culture of Coorg, which is one of the major producers of coffee in India. He also said that the programme would help the youths to develop a positive outlook and a sense of belonging to the nation.

The school authorities accompanied the visitor youths from Kashmir and ensured their safety and comfort. The youths also interacted with the local students and exchanged their views and experiences. The programme, which started on December 26, 2023, will continue till December 31, 2023, and will include visits to other places of cultural, historical, and educational interest in Coorg and Karnataka.
