

Day 4: Visit to Kushal Nagar

The Kashmiri Youth Exchange Programme, sponsored by the Government of India, concluded on Friday at Coorg Public School and PU College, Gonikoppal. The programme was organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Government of Karnataka and Kodava Youth Federation.



The programme aimed to provide exposure and awareness to the youth from Kashmir about the rich cultural and natural diversity of the country, as well as to foster national integration, peace and harmony. Around 120 youths from six districts of Jammu and Kashmir participated in

the six-day programme, which included visits to various places of historical, religious, educational and environmental interest in Coorg and nearby areas.

On the fourth day of the programme, the participants visited Kushalnagar, a town on the Kaveri River, where they witnessed the Buddhist Namdroling Monastery, also known as the Golden Temple, an ornate structure surrounded by groves of sandalwood trees. They also explored the Chiklihole Reservoir and Dam, and the Dubare Elephant Camp, where they interacted with retired logging elephants, crocodiles and leopards.

The programme also involved interactive sessions with social workers, CRPF officials, school students and local youth, where the participants shared their experiences, opinions and aspirations. They also showcased their talents and skills through cultural programmes, sports and games.

The programme concluded with a valedictory function, where the Principal of Coorg Public School and PU College, Dr M Ramachandran, who is also the Secretary General of National UN Volunteers-India, appreciated the organisers and the participants for making the programme a success. He said that the programme was a unique opportunity for the Kashmiri youth to learn about the diverse and vibrant aspects of India, and to develop a sense of belonging and pride for their country. He also hoped that the programme would inspire them to contribute to the development and peace of their state and the nation.

The participants expressed their gratitude and happiness for being part of the programme, and said that they had gained a lot of knowledge, confidence and friendship through the programme. They also said that they would like to visit Coorg and other parts of India again, and to invite the local youth to visit Kashmir.
