Below we listed some of the highlights of 2023 and intended programs for 2024 and, where possible we connected them to the Global Compact principles:

- In 2024 we have organized the first edition of CYE a competition to award the best Creative Young Entrepreneur. A total of 6 entrepreneurs made it to the final in which their business idea is evaluated on different levels. One of the important criteria for evaluation is compliance to UN's global SDG's.
- Many of our local chapters organized events, trainings and coaching sessions for refugees and status holders in the Netherlands. This is directly connected with the pillar Human Rights.
- We actively communicate about the SDG's and encourage members to link their project to these goals. With the implementation of the SDG's we encourage the realization of the SDG's in 2030 together with many others.
- A part of our local chapters have engaged in the World Cleaunup Day. They try to raise awareness on the effects that our consumption patterns, and the garbage that follows out of this, disrupts our world's ecosystem.
