

scheme aims to address the issues of declining child sex ratio, female foeticide, child marriage, and genderbased violence, and to ensure the survival, protection, and education of every girl child.

The theme for National Girl Child Day 2024 is yet to be announced by the government. The theme for 2021 was 'Digital Generation, Our Generation', which focused on the role of digital technologies in empowering girls and creating new opportunities for them.
