- 1500 children were provided with direct assistance through CHILDLINE 1098 service in Gautam Budh Nagar district of Uttar Pradesh and Ukhrul district of Manipur.
- A total of 57 children and women were rescued from Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Bengaluru and Delhi along with concerned district/state Police and Anti Human Trafficking Units mostly from child labour and trafficking in persons for forced labour and sexual exploitation.
- 40 children of sex workers were enrolled in FXBIS' Suraksha Education Centre in Chengrabandha, West Bengal, a center providing safe space with access to education, life skill development, nutrition and overall development through sports, dance etc. A group of children also participated during One billion rising star Campaign, a global action to end violence against women.
- About 47203 persons were reached out in Manipur, Gautam Budh Nagar and West Bengal through various awareness generation and sensitization programs in schools, churches, communities with children, adolescents, parents, women, village headmen, religious leaders community health workers, teachers, medical officers, law enforcement agencies and service providers etc.
- 9 survivors/child victims of trafficking in persons and child sexual abuse were reintegrated with their families in Delhi, Manipur and West Bengal.
- Students/Adolescents/Children anti-trafficking clubs or Children's Cabinet with 500 active members in different schools and Vigilance Groups or Villagers Against Trafficking Club with 139 members were formed in Manipur, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh empowering them as change agents promoting child rights and protection. Some of the clubs were active in executing preventive initiatives while some succeeded in identifying and referring the victims. 6 victims received support service with their active intervention.
- FXBIS' gender module was introduced in three Government primary schools in Gautam Budh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh under Project Saamya, expanding its intervention from the community to Government Schools. 306 children (252 boys & 54 girls) received extensive training on gender and gender equality.
- A Hindi Handbook titled, "Uttar Pradesh Police Training Manual on victim centered investigations in Trafficking in Persons related crimes" was launched and distributed to Nodal AHTUs in Ghaziabad, Meerut and Gautam Budh Nagar for distribution to Police Officials.
- 153 Police officials in Uttar Pradesh were trained, strengthening their capacities on identification and victim centric approach to investigation in trafficking cases.
- Started implementation of "Piloting community led initiatives to address trafficking and child sexual abuse," an initiative to address the issues identified during the action research conducted in 2020-2021 in three districts of Santhal Pargana, Jharkhand.
- FXBIS was invited by the Central Detective Training Institute, Ghaziabad to train 110 Police Officers on a course mandated by the Supreme Court of India to sensitize Police Officials on Juvenile Justice System.
- Through a diverse range of Livelihood Promotion initiatives, FXBIS was able to create an impact on the lives of 1639 individuals this year. One of the organization's Social Business Initiative to empower Rural Women is breaking occupational gender stereotypes by training and employing over 300 women as painters. 75 were also assisted to establish non-conventional hardware outlets in 3 states and enabled them to increase their income through hardware business.
- Over 100 school dropout children were mainstreamed to schools through Suraksha Education Programme in Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Meghalaya States. FXBIS refurbished infrastructure in 41 schools offering child friendly learning facilities including WASH facilities for over 5000 poor children. Among the other notable initiatives, smart classrooms in over 15 schools, and Digital Learning Centres were instrumental in reducing digital divide in the rural areas in Assam and West Bengal.
- Improved the nutritional intake of over 20,000 children through the meal distribution program in the improve the health of under nourished children.

- FXBIS's Project Saamya, an initiative to foster gender equity among young boys within the age group of 8-12 years, was awarded the 'Gender Equality Initiative of the Year- 2022' by the Indian Social Impact Awards.
- FXBIS continued to run the 24*7 child in distress helpline service called "Childline 1098" in Gautam Budh Nagar district of Uttar Pradesh (India's most populated province) and Ukhul district of Manipur (a tribal district in the Northeastern part of India, prominent source state for human trafficking within India and outside its borders) until August and October, 2023 respectively. In 2023, the service was adopted by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India to be fully implemented by the Government through District Child Protection Units in all the districts of India.
- FXBIS' CEO Mr. Satya Prakash was invited as a resource person at the Zonal Conference on effective implementation of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act 2015 and POCSO Act 2012 in Gautam Budh Nagar, Bareilly, Kanpur and Prayagraj under the aegis of the Juvenile Justice Committee, Allahabad High Court, Judicial Research Training & Institute and UNICEF, Lucknow, participated by District Judges, Special Judges & Special Public Prosecutor (POCSO), Secretary, DLSA, CWC, JJB, SJPU and Doctors of District Women's Hospital, Uttar Pradesh.
- V.V. GIRI NLI (National Labour Institute), an autonomous body of the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India invited FXBIS for 6 multi stakeholder training programs on strengthening the mechanism for child labour, bonded labour and human trafficking in India. Overall, 300 stakeholders were trained till January 2024. Representatives from Labour Department (Centre and state), Vigilance committee members, Police, Anti Human Trafficking Units, Revenue Officials, District Legal Services Authorities (DLSA), NGOs, Child Welfare Committees, District Task Force, Social Workers, District Legal Aid Officers and Para Legal Volunteers.
- FXBIS developed a "CHECKLIST" titled- Indicators/Risk Factors for Screening and Identification of Persons at Risk of Trafficking or Victims of Trafficking in Persons. FXBIS was invited to train Police Officers in Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Punjab wherein the CHECKLIST was introduced during the trainings. The checklist has been well received and is being implemented by the police in intercepting cases of trafficking in the respective states.
- FXBIS had assisted weavers to set up complete eco system for production of handloom products such as weaving workshops, thread dying units, tailoring units, silk production units and rural and urban outlets. 700 women weavers have been impacted through this livelihood promotion activity bridging the gender gap in income generation in rural Assam.
