2019... QUITE CHALLENGING FOR THE GLOBAL SOUTH

With the establishment of the 1st UN Technical aid programme by the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), the history of the South - South Cooperation (SSC) began in 1949, about five years after the establishment of the UN. While SSC marks 70 years of existence in 2019, the Group of 77 @ the UN, a coalition of 134 developing nations, created to promote the South-South collective socio-economic interests and create an enhanced joint negotiating capacity in the UN, will be 55. Notably the Africa Development Bank will be celebrating the same year with the G77@the UN while the South Centre, an inter-governmental organisation of developing countries acting as an independent policy think tank will be 24 years old, and to promote Afro-Asian economic and cultural cooperation and oppose colonialism and neo-colonialism, an important step toward the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), the Afro-Asian Conference (Bandung Conference) was held in April 1955 and on its 50th anniversary held in Indonesia, the New Asian - African Strategic Partnership (NAASP) was launched. The 60th anniversary in 2015 was celebrated in style by heads of government and intergovernmental organisations from across Asia and Africa.

With all the aforementioned in existence it is quite saddening that rather than liberal democratic governance, shared prosperity and social equality in place within the Global South by the 21st century, the North-South Divide continues to widen and may lead to a big quilt, particularly in the face of rapidly evolving digital ecosystem with its pervasive influence and massive disruptions, says Prof (Dr) Marius E. Adimadu JP, an Executive Board Member of the Global South Economic Forum (GSEF) and Executive Chairman, African Centre for Economic Research and Policy Analysis (ACEPA). The widening gap he reiterated, is further deepened by the pervasive influence of the rapidly evolving 4th Industrial Revolution. With its massive disruptions, he cautioned, the transformative power of the digital era may further escalate extreme poverty in the Global South, notably in the continent of Africa.

GSEF - The Global South Economic Forum's intervention and initiatives, the erudite professor describes, as timely and provides a platform to galvanize global support to bridge the burgeoning economic gulf between the prosperous North and the decadent South.

BAPA+40 - UNOSSC

On the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the adoption of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action for Promoting and Implementing Technical Cooperation among developing countries (TCDC), the Second High-Level UN Conference on South-South Cooperation will be held in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from 20 to 22 March 2019. Expected to result in a concise, focussed, forward-looking action-oriented intergovernmentally agreed outcome, the UN General Assembly as described SSC as "an important element of international cooperation for development which offers viable opportunities for developing countries sustained economic growth and sustainable development".

AT LAST... 1ST AFRICAN SOUTH SOUTH COOPERATION REPORT



The first African South-South Cooperation (SSC) Report endorsed by the AU will be officially presented at the High-Level Meeting on SSC, the Buenos Aires Plan of Action (BAPA+40) in March 2019. Under the overall coordination of the UNDP Regional Service Centre for Africa, and in collaboration with NEPAD's Planning and Coordinating Agency,

representatives from 15 African countries in April 2018, formally launch the Africa SSC Report. According to one of the participants, key institutional challenges and opportunities within the continent are some of the highlights of the report. South-South Cooperation, also known as the Global South is a partnership for the exchange of resources, technology and knowledge between developing countries.

Can the UN be fit for Purpose?

Eleven more years to come for the United Nations to present its score card, on the world's delivery of the 2030 Agenda - a promise for Dignity Prosperity and Peace on a Healthy Planet - the year 2019 will certainly decide and give justification as to the readiness of the UN management for effective and efficient service, through the new radical changes being put forward by the UN Secretary-General's Development System Reform Initiative, declares the Founder and Executive Chairman of the Global South Economic Forum (GSEF), Abdul Dewale Mohammed, at a recent GSEF End of Year Lecture attended by policy makers, renowned academics, researchers, youth leaders, corporate and media chiefs. .

The UN is the cornerstone of multilateralism and the SDGs is the boldest framework put forward by the UN for advancing the well being of mankind. According to the GSEF Executive Chairman, who is also the Founder and Group Executive President of the Africa Asia Scholars Global Network (AASGN), without a concrete transformation and overhaul of the UN operative system, a complete change in Mind Set through an imbued culture of transparency, accountability and evidenced stewardship of good practices, the UN management shall continue to be less effective and incapable of making substantial progress on set targets. Often he stated, out-going heads of government with no proving track record of selfless service to their people are inappropriately and wrongly appointed as heads of UN agencies, high level panels and committees. Equally with loose coordination, the objectives of a number of agencies overlap, thereby making the UN highly bureaucratic expensive to manage, coordinate and efficiently monitor performance.

A signatory to the UN Global Compact (UNGC) and member of the UN Stakeholders for Sustainable Development (UKSSD), Abdul Dewale Mohammed recast the failure of the UN to address the gender disparity within its workforce for well over 18 years of its initial target.

He however praised Antonio Guterres for boldly admitting to UN shortcomings and the fact that a lot of people have been left behind, which thus require a drastic change within the UN. He prays that the Secretary-General's new radical reforms particularly that of reenergising the Secretariat's management framework to enable and support actions aimed at transforming the UN for effective Leadership, Coordination, Accountability and efficient Delivery of the 17 SDGs will come to pass.

The speech of the UN Secretary-General to the General Assembly before assuming office in 2016, stated the GSEF Chairman, should always resonate in our minds and deeds. With the Global South being the worst hit with Africa much in turmoil, the great divide between people and political establishments, continues to rise unabated. He agrees with the head of the UN that many have lost confidence not only in their government but in global institutions including the UN. Anasir's call on the UN and world leaders to reconstruct relations with their people, listen and care for their needs and aspirations for stability and solidarity on which we all depend to reign, should, for the sake of present and future generations, not in any form be downplayed, reiterated the Chief of GSEF. Posture, he noted, shall be the judge of our inaction to correct the imbalances in our fractured world.

Over the years, the UN's agenda has expanded to include almost every aspect of human endeavour and planetary resource. In addition, it supports member states in areas such as policy development, research, training and the establishment of peace.

The UN can counsel, boost, persuade and censure, but it has few enforcement powers, which makes the human rights and the international rule of law inimical to millions of people particularly the youths.

Commenting on the outcome of the just concluded, 78th UN General Assembly in New York, the founder and group executive president of the Africa Asia Scholars Global Network (AASGON) and Chairman of the Global South Economic Forum (GSEF), Abdul Dewale Mohammed stated that 'many UN successes are the result of states coming together for the common good, resulting in huge transformations. He however pointed out, it is imperative that to successfully 'build the future we All want' a world fit for purpose, the supremacy of government and the UN, which seems increasingly challenged and incapable of enforcing lay down rules must be honestly, concretely and decisively addressed.

According to ADM, the academia and entrepreneurs continue to be fascinated with the universal principles of the UN Global Compact (UNGC) notably on human and labour rights, respect for the environment, anti-corruption, ethical principles and standards. He call to question its overall achievement and bearing on the civil society, chiefly in the developing countries of the Global South, since its launch 23years ago in Davos by Dr. Kofi Annan, the erstwhile UN Secretary-General.

Without justice equity and fairness there can never be trust and without trust a society is disaster-prone, he lamented. For us to imbibe positive mindset and moderation, change our perception of life, live and let live, and understanding the purpose of

human existence, its obvious that mutual trust which breeds equity, inclusion, sustainability and peace will habitually, be consequential in ensuring an enduring healthy and proactive public private partnership that will protect planet earth and create a better world for present and future generations.

Building on trust, Abdul strongly considers proactive Partnership as the panacea for the attainment of SDGs. As a signatory to the UN Global Compact, he said he clearly expressed his recommendation to the UN Secretary-General in May 2022. Through the adoption of people centred policies and practices, he reiterated that SDGs Goal 17 - Partnership, is the key factor that the success of the SDGs ambitious targets hinges on.



Decisive action for transformative social change through a more practical and strategic process that will effect revolutionary change within our troubled and endemic society is today, indispensable if we are to truly and meaningfully, in the coming years, achieve the SDGs For the creation of a proportionate and compassionate world, that brings forth greater hope for the realization of the Global Compact principles and the 2030 SDGs Agenda, AASGON and GSEF he concluded, yearn for good governance and an accountable UN. However, for this to manifest and realistically come to light, the 17th Goal 'Public Private Partnership', build on trust and inclusion, must be reinforced by the UN as the foundation for the most crucial and cardinal 'Social Change'.

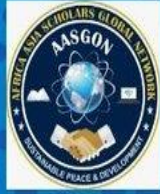

AASGON/SEF Official Meetings with the Vice President of the Republic of South Sudan at Lucknow and New Delhi in India on the 13th and 16th of June 2021

Following the success of the India – Africa Forum Summit held in New Delhi in April 2008, the Prime Minister of India announced the Government of India's initiative to enhance the academic opportunities for students of African countries in India by increasing the number of scholarships for them to pursue undergraduate, post-graduate and higher courses.

In line with the policy of the Indian Government and Principles of the 1955 Asia-Africa Conference (the Bandung Spirit) for which India continues to play a pioneering role, the Africa Asia Scholars Global Network (AASGON) in partnership with the Global South Economic Forum (GSEF), the Indian Society for Technical Education (ISTE) and the Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific (AUAP), the Association of Arab Association (AARU) and the Association of African Universities (AAU), under the umbrella of the Global South Universities Association (GSUA), acknowledge the need to conduct the 1st Asia-Africa Scholarship Summit Global Awards Expo (AASGAE) for Africa's attainment of sustainable development and facilitation of the Africa Union Agenda 2063.

Considering the exclusive importance of Scholarship to the attainment of the UN 2030 Sustainable Development Goals, the conduct of AASGAE is in fulfilment of the promise made by the Africa Asia Scholars Global Network (AASGON), a signatory to the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC), and member of the UK Stakeholders for Sustainable Development (UKSSD), to the Vice President of South Sudan, when they both met in a closed door meeting in Lucknow and New Delhi, India in 2020.

As a follow up to the planning of AASGAE, the AASGON Founder and Group Executive President on the invite of the South Sudan Vice President, also in June 2021, went on a fact finding tour of South Sudan, the world's youngest country, ravaged by years of protracted war.

Commemorating the 14th Anniversary of the Nelson Mandela International Day and the 9th Anniversary of the World Youth Skills Day, AASGON is expected to officially declare open the Asia –Africa Scholarship Summit, where, at the Le Meridien Hotel, in New Delhi, on the 15th - 18th of July 2023, the 1st batch of beneficiaries of the Scholarship grant shall be presented with their awards.

AASGAE provides the enabling platform for heads of international, national and local organisations offering funding, bursaries, grants, awards and scholarships to network and share notes as well as engage with heads of government, diplomats, decision makers, researchers, corporate chiefs, philanthropists, scholars and students from different parts of the world, notably Asia, Arab and African Countries. Major highlights of the august occasion are: the AASGON Prestigious Education Award Presentation, official launch of the £120m Africa Future Leaders Scholarship Endowment Fund (AFL-SEF), the Life and Education in India-Africa Project. The summit will also feature a Cultural/Musical Concert and the 1st India-Africa International Cricket and Football Competition.

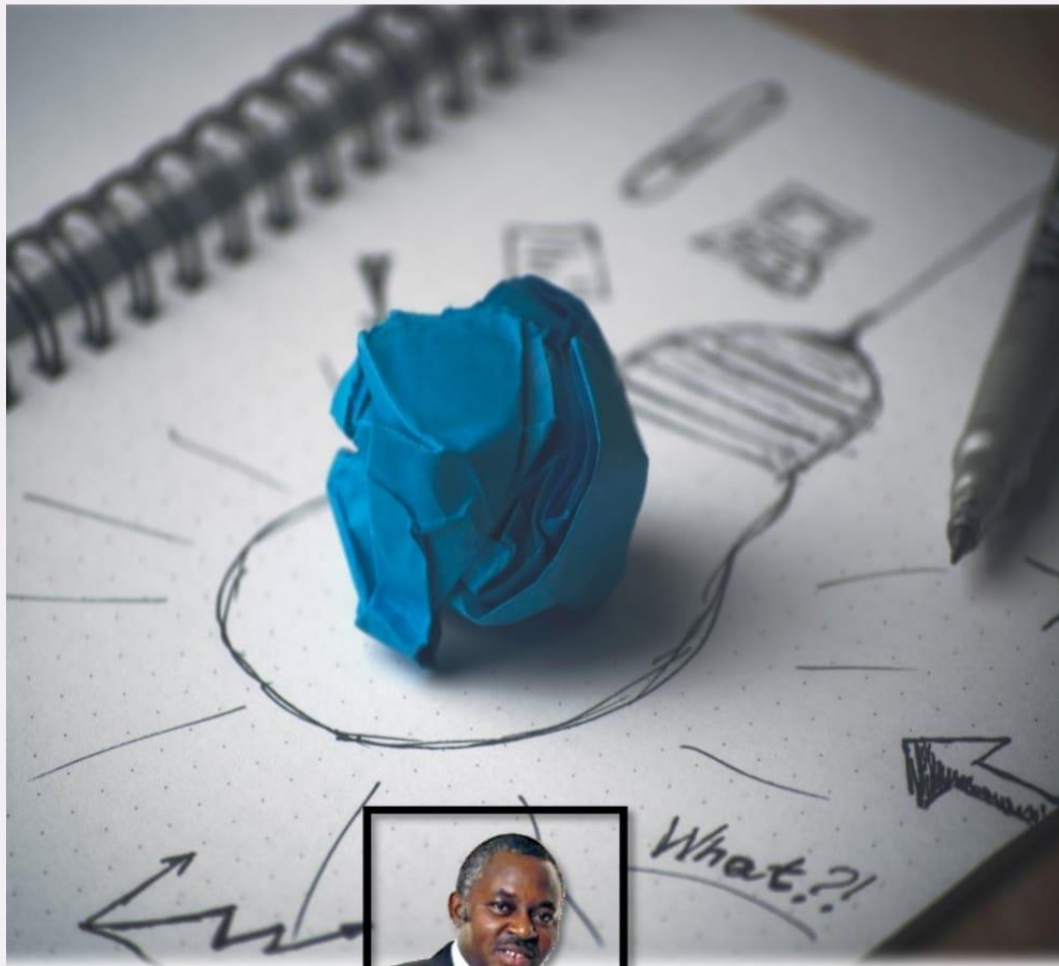

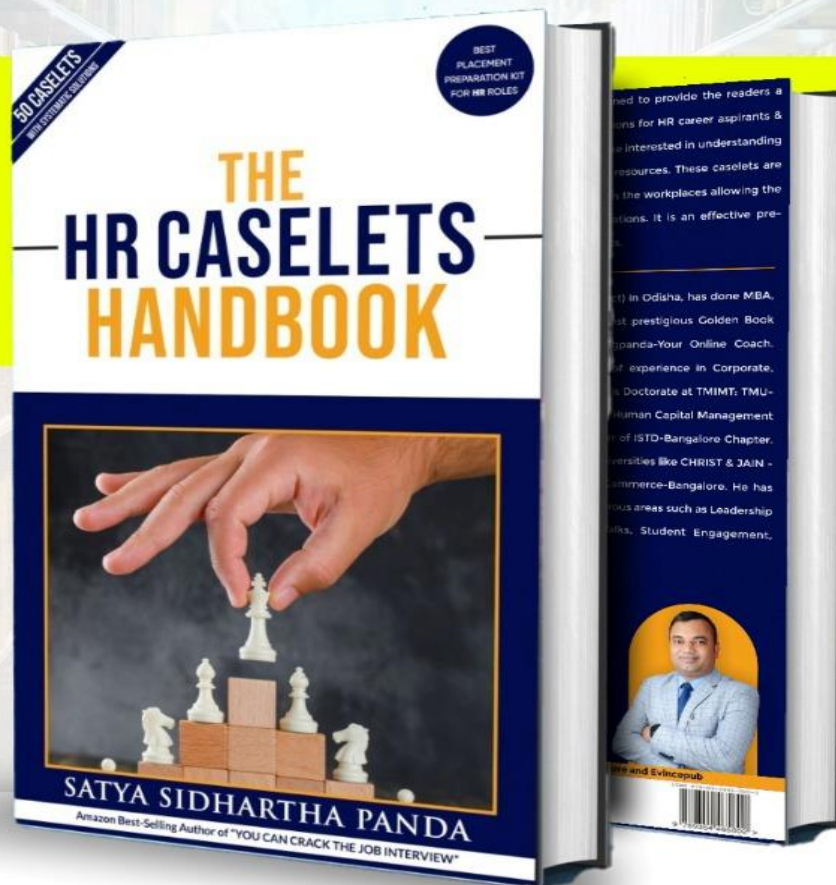
