ENVIRONMENT

SFH new environmental policy, implemented in 2024, demonstrates our commitment to SDG 13 (Climate Action). Our approach focuses on:

- **Carbon Emission Reduction:** SFH is reducing its carbon footprint through energy-efficient practices and promoting the use of renewable energy in its operations.
- Water Stewardship and Pollution Control: Our WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) projects, in partnership with Procter & Gamble, have expanded to rural communities, increasing access to clean water and sanitation while reducing waterborne diseases.
- Waste Management: SFH has implemented new protocols for managing waste, including recycling initiatives and reducing paper use by transitioning to digital platforms.



HUMAN RIGHTS

SFH's programmes remain centered on promoting human rights, particularly through inclusive healthcare services. Our KPCARE 2 and Global Fund projects continue to provide comprehensive HIV/STI care for key populations, ensuring their rights are protected and healthcare access is equitable. We also provide legal support to those facing human rights violations, aligning with SDG 5 (Gender Equality) and SDG 10 (Reduced Inequality).

LABOUR

SFH continues to promote an inclusive, non-discriminatory workplace, emphasising gender equality and diversity in alignment with SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth). Our equal opportunity and anti-harassment policies ensure that all employees are treated with dignity and respect.

ANTI-CORRUPTION

SFH remains committed to SDG 16 (Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions) by embedding strong anti-corruption measures across all levels of our operations. We provide annual training on anti-corruption practices and have implemented a whistleblower policy, encouraging employees and stakeholders to report unethical behavior.

LOCAL NETWORK ACTIVITIES


