Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

I am pleased to confirm that Zify, supports the *Ten Principles* of the United Nations Global Compact act on Human Rights, Labor, Environment and Anti-corruption.

With this communication, we express our intent to implement all the principles. We at Zify, will stay committed to making the United Nations Global Compact and the ten principles part of the strategy, culture and day-to-day operations of our company. We shall engage in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the UN, particularly, the *Sustainability Development Goals* (SDG). Zify will communicate its clear-cut statement of commitment to all stakeholders and public at large.

We acknowledge that a key requirement for participating in the UN Global Compact, is the annual submission of a *Communication on Progress* (COP) that describes our company's efforts to implementing the ten principles. We do support public accountability and transparency. Therefore, we commit to report on progress within <u>one year</u> of joining the United Nations Global Compact and annually thereafter according to the COP policy. This will include:

- A statement signed by the chief executive, expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and principles. This is separate from our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- A description of practical actions (i.e., regarding disclosure of any relevant policies, procedures, activities) that Zify has taken or plans to take up, so as to implement the principles in each of the four issue areas. (human rights, labor, environment, anti-corruption)
- A legitimate measurement of outcomes (i.e., the degree to which targets/performance indicator were met) or other qualitative and quantitative measurements of the result.
