Letter of Commitment to UN Global Compact

African Trade Center write to express our support for the 10 principles of the United Nations Global Compact with respect to human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption.

With this communication, we express our intent to advance those principles within our sphere of influence. We are committed to making the Global Compact and its principles part of the strategy, culture and day-to-day operations of our company, and to engaging in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals. African Trade Center will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (COP) that describes our company's efforts to implement the ten principles. We support public accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on progress within one year of joining the Global Compact, and annually thereafter according to the Global Compact COP policy. This includes:

- A statement signed by the Executive Vice President expressing continued support for the Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles.
- A description of practical actions that the company has taken (or plans to undertake) to implement the Global Compact principles in each of the four issue areas of human rights, labour, environment, anti-corruption), and
- A measurement of outcomes of our activities.
