## **Re: United Nations Global Compact – Letter of Commitment**

Dear Mr. Secretary-General:

I am pleased to confirm that MultiGreen Properties, LLC (the “Company” or “MultiGreen”), supports the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labor, environment, and anti-corruption. MultiGreen is committed to making the UN Global Compact and its principles part of the strategy, culture, and operations of the company. The MultiGreen mission is SDG-oriented. We are engaging in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly, the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. MultiGreen as and will continue to make statements of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

MultiGreen is a real estate operating company exclusively focused on constructing sustainable, attainable, and tech-enabled multifamily housing in the United States. MultiGreen aspires to build 40,000 new attainable multifamily units by 2030. The official launch date for MultiGreen was on January 20<sup>th</sup> at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is separate from our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact;
- A description of practical actions (i.e., disclosure of any relevant policies, procedures, activities), that the company has taken, or plans to undertake, to implement the UN Global Compact principles in each of the four issue areas (human rights, labor, environment, anti-corruption); and
- A measurement of outcome (i.e., the degree to which targets/performance indicators were met, or other qualitative or quantitative measurements of results).
