Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

I am pleased to inform you that NASDAQ OMX fully supports the ten principles of the Global Compact with respect to human rights, labor, environment, and anti-corruption (listed below) and intends to advance these principles, to the best of our abilities and within our sphere of influence.

Human Rights	 Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights; and make sure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.
Labor	 Businesses should uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining; the elimination of all forms of forced and compulsory labor; the effective abolition of child labor; and the elimination of discrimination with respect to employment and occupation.
Environment	 Businesses should support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges; undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility; and encourage the development and diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies.
Anti-Corruption	 Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery.

NASDAQ OMX is committed to making the Global Compact and these principles part of the strategy, culture, and strategic operations of our company. We will endeavor to find collaborative projects that advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Millennium Development Goals.

In addition, NASDAQ OMX will provide you with a Communication on Progress (COP), describing our company's ongoing efforts to implement the ten principles, within one year of the date of this letter—and on an annual basis thereafter.
