Our Motivation

The seas and oceans cover 70% of Earth's surface. They are the habitat of more than 90% of the living biomass and provide multiple resources and benefits to the human race.

Today, more than half of the world's population depends on the marine resources as their primary food source, but aquatic environments are the most fragile and most impacted by the industrial and domestic activities that, for their development, are man-made on land.

The waters of Venezuela aren't immune from this threat. The State exercises sovereignty over some 860,000 km² of the Caribbean Sea, 2813 km of coastline, and more than 300 islands.



The most important biochemical cycles of the region are produced are produced in these spaces and they convert the Venezuelan sea into one of the richest biotic systems of the world, and consequently a strategic point for the economic and food security of the nation.

In Fundación La Tortuga we are convinced that the scientific research and application of the acquired knowledge in the implementation of correct management plans and effective environmental education programs for people of all levels, will allow the sustainable use of marine resources and a greater understanding of the benefits for present and future generations.

Scientific Activities



Design and execution of programs for the protection of endangered marine species.


Design and implementation of correct plans for the management of natural resources.
