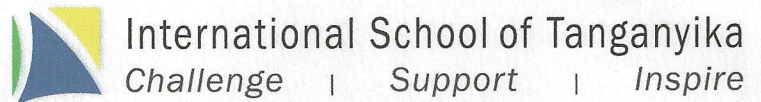

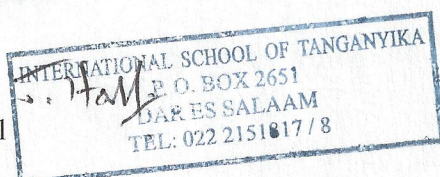
We also pledge to participate in and engage with the UN Global Compact in the following ways:

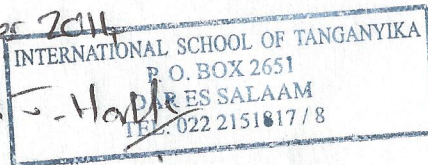
