Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

General Motors Company has analyzed its current policies, principles, processes, and practices and has found close alignment between them and the UN Global Compact's ten principles.

With this commitment letter, I am pleased to express GM's support of the Global Compact's ten principles and the company's intent to maintain the principles and to evaluate related global best practices that may be applicable to GM. Furthermore, we will also evaluate collaboration opportunities through the UN Global Compact network which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, including the Sustainable Development Goals.

GM supports public accountability and transparency, and recognizes that a key requirement for participation in the Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (COP) that describes GM's efforts to implement the ten principles. Since 2010, GM has issued an annual global sustainability report and our forthcoming May 2016 report will clearly state to our stakeholders and the general public our commitment to the Global Compact. According to the COP requirements, annually we will include:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles.
- A description of practical actions that the company has taken or plans to undertake to strengthen our alignment with the ten Global Compact principles.
- A measurement of outcomes (i.e., the degree to which targets/performance indicators were met, or other qualitative or quantitative measurements of results).
