It is your mission to create a sustainable and inclusive global economy that delivers lasting benefits to people, communities and markets. And to make this happen, the UN Global Compact supports companies to:

- Do business responsibly by aligning their strategies and operations with Ten Principles on human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption; and
- Take strategic actions to advance broader societal goals, such as the forthcoming UN Sustainable Development Goals, with an emphasis on collaboration and innovation.

World Sustainability Fund commits itself to support the UN Global Compact.

From 1981 WSF her founder contribute to sustainable development and in 2010 as well to the United Nations draft document for RIO+20, called The World We Want. He recognized that the document aimed not high enough to solve actual climate problem to guarantee a sustainable future. So in 2011 he founded WSF and wrote a program called The World We Need to create the world we needed together!

### **WSF Communication on Engagement (COE)**

WSF target for the next two year focus on four impact levels: 1. Global+, 2. Country+, 3. City+, and 4. Private+.

- 1. **WSF her Global+ department** (Major Groups and United Nations) does research and gives advice, steering, deliberation, and monitoring. It communicates on monthly basis to all Heads of States, Ambassadors to the UN, Bureau, Speakers, Major Groups, 1500 institutions, NGO's, and individual relations. Samples of this are:

The 2016-2017 aim is to continue this service and establish WSF offices in New York and Geneva to intensify this interaction by more personal participation.

- 7. Signing and cashing the SD SIP Agreement
- 8. Opening the WSF local Country Office
- 9. Producing UN (LoanScheme request &) PDD Project Design Documents
- 10. Getting additional funding
- 11. Starting CDM and Post 2015 Agenda projects



WSF developed a toolbox for country analyzes and planning. By applying in the toolbox the CDPM and WSF get a good vision of what a country thinks to need and who are potential partners and stakeholders. After we are ready with the toolbox, we will fine-tune the "10 Projects" draft plan by fitting it in "WSF Triple P Matrix": Standard Project Estimates Returns for Planet, People, and Profit.

Having done that, our Marketing department will produce a brochure for promotion, containing an introduction of WSF, a short vision on Tanzania's opportunities, the 10 projects proposal (100M\$), and the contacts and potential partners (PP) overview.

With this the CDPM and the WSF Team are ready to contact the Government, PP, and 1M\$ to 20M\$ investors (1MS investment and up to 19M\$ sponsoring). The Sponsor-Investor will get six Main Profit Scenario's:

- 1. A guaranteed return on investment of 10M\$ within 5 to 10 years, investment back within 2 year;
- 2. Extra investment "First Right" to related projects loans up to 80M\$ within 2 year;
- 3. "First Investment Right" multiple spin-off loans for later projects within the country;
- 4. Involvement in Promotion and Marketing of the Country Program, Projects, Procurement, Production, and Products Sales;
- 5. Co-beneficiary of estimated sustainable Returns for Planet and People;
- 6. Member of the WSF Global Network Partner promotion, UN & WSF SDGs 2030 Agenda Science & Projects insights (CDM, SDG, UN related finance), Triple-P and investment opportunities.

- 3. **City+** (Business and City) Sustainable Development will start automatically when a country office opens. WSF aim to support in 2016-2017 600 cities and 600 businesses with CDM. and SDGs.
  - 3.1. Facts and figures
  - Half of humanity 3.5 billion people live in cities today; by 2030, almost 60%.
  - 95% of urban expansion in the next decades will take place in developing world.
  - 828 million people live in slums today and the number keeps rising.





- The world's cities occupy just 2% of the Earth's land, but account for 60-80% of energy consumption and 75% of carbon emissions.
- Rapid urbanization is exerting pressure on fresh water supplies, sewage, the living environment, and public health.
- But the high density of cities can bring efficiency gains and technological innovation while reducing resource and energy consumption.


