

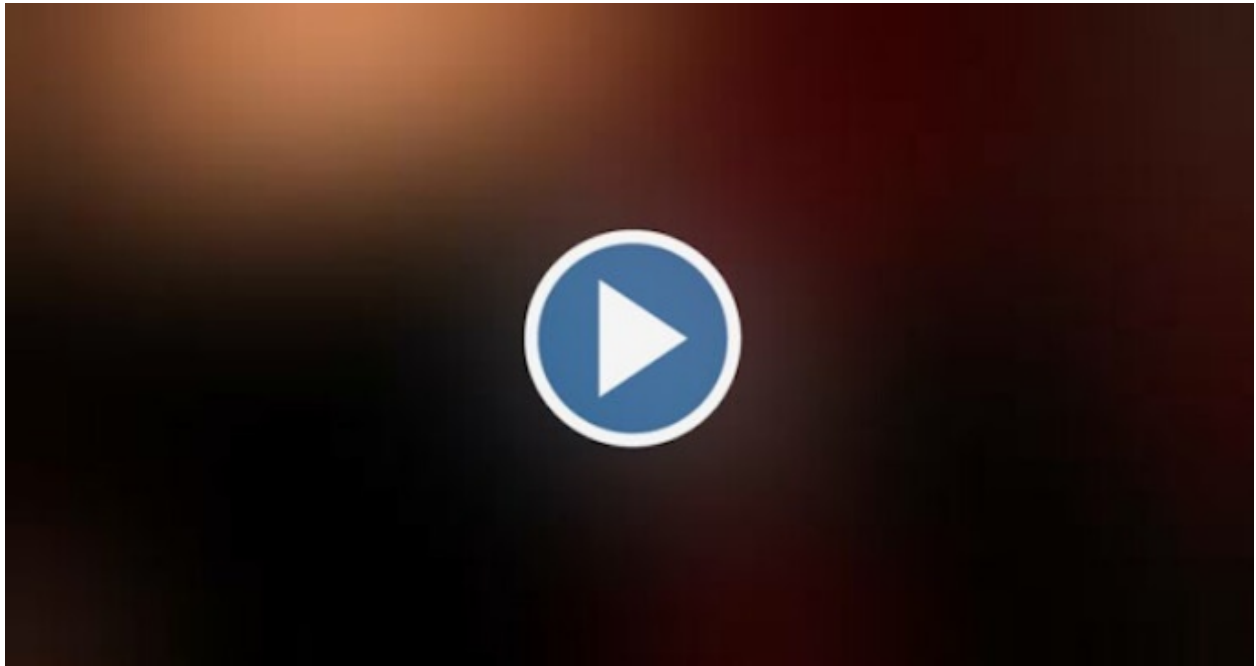
Sister Hong Viral video original XXX VIDEOS - | xHamster, XNXX.COM
